This prayer comes from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, written in 1979:

Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us.

No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow.

We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.

This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.

It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers; not master builders; ministers, not Messiahs. We are prophets of a future, not our own.

What is our *something?* How do we take an honest look at what we can do, and do it well? As we refresh and renew ourselves with summer activities, let us contemplate the world around us. Summer can be a time to plant the seeds of new ways to be a community of faith caring for, serving, and supporting the vulnerable among us.
