I am excited to report that Dr. Robin R. Koozer has returned to the First Presbyterian Church staff as Interim Chancel Choir Director until December 31st. giving our music staff search committee more time in its work. Also, Dr. Byron Jensen will be our Interim Director of Adult and Youth Handbells this fall.

I trust you will join me in thanking Robin and Byron for assisting in the music ministry in this transitional time. Ashley Erich will continue as our organist, along with Linda Johnson, Tim and Teresa Canady, Mary Plock, and Alice Throckmorton on our talented music staff.

After our wonderful kick-off Sunday with Stephanie Brader and Kili Wenburg leading our new staffing in education and spiritual formation, the return of our chancel choir, the commissioning of our Pastor Nominating Committee, the visit of our transitional presbytery executive (Dr. Charles R. Traylor), among other activities, the session met and voted unanimously to install a new sound system, plus video options, and a hearing assisted system for our church sanctuary. This project of approximately \$100,000 will be entirely funded by generous gifts from members for this project, including one anonymous gift of \$50,000 that jump-started this "forward in faith" investment in the future of First Presbyterian Church, Hastings. It is our hope to complete the work before Thanksgiving.

The Church and Immigration

God's care for the plight of foreigners is pervasive in the Bible, and so is the call to God's people to treat them in a fair, loving and sustainable way. Leviticus 19:33-34

When an alien lives with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. The alien who resides with you shall be to you as a citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt. (This is one of more than 50 similar verses in Leviticus and Deuteronomy.)

Matthew 25:38-40

'And when was it that we saw you as a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the King will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'
