Dear Fellow Companions of the Way,

One of the more challenging stories Jesus told is often called the parable of "the laborers in the vineyard." (*Matthew 20:1-16*) In this story, some of the workers feel they are "entitled" to more than others. We live in a society that feeds an entitlement attitude. The entitlement attitude says, "life owes me something," or "people owe me something," or "God owes me something." But entitlement is a perversion of reality. There is nothing in the universe that says, "we deserve to live a long, happy, and successful life."

Eliminating entitlement from your life and embracing gratitude is spiritually and psychologically liberating. Gratitude is the recognition that life owes me nothing and all the good I have is a gift by the grace of God. My life is a gift. So is my spouse, my clothes, my work and my every breath. Recognizing that everything good in life is ultimately a gift is a fundamental truth of reality. And seeing everything good we have as a gift leads us to the reality of a giver and the source of all goodness: God. Gratitude is where we begin to experience God in a powerfully personal way.

A children's hymn, written in 1897, declares:

Count your blessings, name them one by one, Count your blessings, see what God hath done! Count your blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you, what the Lord hath done!

Count your blessings. Write them in a daily journal. Thank God, the source of all good, and grow closer to God in an authentic and joyful way.
