Trinity Sunday

Trinity Sunday originated about 1000 C.E. in northern Europe and in 1334 the festival was accepted into the official calendar of the Western Church and ordered that it should be held on the Sunday after Pentecost. It is the only church festival honoring a doctrine – the mystery of God – rather than an event or a person. *Mystery*, in this connection, means a supernatural fact revealed by God, which in itself transcends the natural power of human reasoning. Trinity Sunday proclaims the Triune God, into whose name we are baptized, and who is active in redeeming the world.

The location of this feast on the Sunday after Pentecost may be interpreted as a grateful look back at the complete mystery of salvation, which according to early theology, is accomplished by the Father, through the Son in the Holy Spirit.

Since it is a day of celebration, the color is white – the festival color of the Church. The festal service includes "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of God's glory." (*Isaiah 6:3*) and "for God so loved the world..." (*John 3:16*)

In celebrating Trinity Sunday we should remember that every Sunday is consecrated to the Triune God. On the first day of the week, God began creation. On the first day of the week, God raised Jesus from the grave. On the first day of the week, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Church. Every Sunday we celebrate the Holy Trinity!

The Apostle Paul wrote, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who consoles us in all our affliction, for just as the sufferings of Christ are abundant for us, so our consolation is abundant for us through Christ, sealed in our hearts through the power and constant presence of the Holy Spirit." (2 Corinthians 1:3-5,21-22)

John Calvin declared, "Christ is not only the pledge of our adoption, but God also gives us the Holy Spirit as a witness to this adoption, through whom we may freely cry aloud, 'Abba, Father.' Whenever we are distressed, remember to ask for the presence of the Spirit who will enable us to pray boldly." (*Institutes*, III.20.37)
