First Presbyterian Church will be getting a new audio-visual system this month!

We will be replacing our ancient sound system that is more than 25 years old. Sound system improvements include: 1) Sound Desk - Located in the sanctuary so the operator is part of the service and can get a more accurate sound balance; 2) Speakers - Two speakers in the Sanctuary, two in the Balcony, and two in the Memorial Room to help improve sound coverage and guality in all seats; 3) Microphones- Two handhelds, three headset, one solo, and two choir microphones to help with clarity and quality of pickup; 4) Digital Snake - A method of cabling that will allow connecting a multitude of equipment at the front of the sanctuary with a simple single connection; and 5) Hearing Loop - Telecoil enabled hearing aids will be able to hear the audio on the ground floor of the sanctuary automatically. (Hearing Loop installation is scheduled for a later date next year.) Video improvements include: 1) Hi-Def Cameras - Two cameras under balcony, one in front to allow recording and projecting images from multiple angles; and 2) Televisions- Two screens at the front facing the congregation. One screen will be on the balcony facing the choir and pastor. This will give FPC an additional tool to help present the Message of God in new ways. Additional information may be found online at:

Dear Fellow Companions of the Way,

"Though the fig tree does not blossom, and no fruit is on the vines; though the produce of the olive fails and the fields yield no food; though the flock is cut off from the fold and there is no herd in the stalls, yet I will rejoice in the Lord; I will exult in the God of my salvation. God, the Lord, is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, and makes me tread upon the heights." – Habakkuk 3:17-19a

Perhaps this is an odd text to place in our newsletter the week before we celebrate Thanksgiving. I happen to think it is, in its own way, appropriate. The Old Testament prophet also lived in a time of dislocation and loss. Yet the vision that he received from God, and his attitude of gratitude, went far beyond clichés about God's blessings. When people suffer, God is always there. This was what Habakkuk discovered, and it formed the center of his message. As the Pilgrims celebrated a day of Thanksgiving after their first harvest in 1621, they remembered that a majority from the Mayflower had perished in the winter of 1620 from lack of provisions. The apostle Paul wrote for us *"to give thanks in all circumstances."* (1 Thessalonians 5:18) Note, not for all things, but in all circumstances. We give thanks, not only because of what we have, but because God is always with us and inspires us to care for one another. And following Thanksgiving, we look forward to the season of Advent, when we celebrate the three-fold coming of Christ: future, past, and present.
