Dear Fellow Companions of the Way,

"A Christmas Prayer for Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and Beyond..."

Again, this Christmas 2015, the town of Bethlehem is under an intolerant military occupation as it has been for decades. As world peace is largely dependent on the search for peace between Palestine and Israel, Palestinian Christians released a statement "A Moment of Truth" six years ago this month (December 11, 2009) popularly referred to as the "The Kairos Palestine Document." I was privileged to lead a discussion of the document at the gathering of the "Covenanting for Justice Work Group of the World Alliance (now Communion) of Reformed Churches, Caribbean and North American Region" in January 2010. It is an inspiring statement from brothers and sisters in Christ in the Holy Land. I commend it to you as a Christmas prayer.
