### Women of the Reformation Tour, August 31-September 8, 2016

Travel to Geneva, Switzerland and southern France to learn about Presbyterians' faith heritage. Learn about contributions women made to the Protestant Reformation and about the persecution of the early Protestants living in France during the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. Celebrate our common Reformed heritage with members of the United Protestant Church of France at the annual *Assemblee du Desert* on Sunday, September 4.

The cost for the trip is \$2,000 per person, based on shared housing (\$250 single supplement, as available). The price includes all meals; public transportation in Geneva; round-trip transportation from Geneva to Sommieres, France; and sightseeing in Geneva and southern France. Round-trip air fare to Geneva is not included in the cost of the tour.
