## Why ask “Why?” ...

Habit and obligation dictate many of our daily decisions. But when habits get boring and obligations feel like burdens, with what motivations are we left? Together, we'll pause to look more deeply at why we do what we do so that we can refresh our lives with intentionality, purpose, and joy!

Over the course of the Winter/Spring semester, Forum classes are addressing the “Why?” question from each of four different monthly vantage points, continuing with March's theme, *Sacrifice*.

First, on March 6, **Dr. Mark Zajack**, Hastings College psychology professor, will lead us in considering the psychological and spiritual motivations for sacrifice, which impacts nearly all of our daily choices and habits. On the 13<sup>th</sup>, **Hannah Jensen** will describe the joys and challenges of her semester as a music teacher in the Dominican Republic.
