We are so grateful for your ongoing partnership in our work of feeding starving children and their families through Kids Against Hunger of Hastings. We have two pieces of news to share and celebrate with you.

The first is that we passed the 4 million meal mark this summer! That's an incredible milestone after only eight years and you helped us achieve it by providing the opportunity for volunteers from your congregation to put their hearts and hands to work making a difference in the lives of starving people locally and globally.

Connecting with the hearts and hands of area youth and adults hungry to join in our mission to feed hungry people is also the idea behind our second bit of news. We are changing our name from Kids Against Hunger of Hastings to Hearts & Hands Against Hunger of Hastings. With the name change we eliminate unnecessary franchise expenses and put money toward purchasing food.

Nothing but our name changes—we are still the same people in the same place with the same passion for feeding starving people around the world and around our community. We continue to provide life-saving meals to places like Haiti, the Philippines, Ecuador, Latvia and many, many other countries. We also provide meals to area food pantries, homeless shelters, assistance programs and churches engaged in feeding the hungry in our community.

Meals are picked up at Good Samaritan Village and distributed to homebound individuals throughout Hastings.

We welcome volunteers of any age, but if you are 55 and over, you are covered under our insurance policy while driving on volunteer business.

Delivering **Meals on Wheels** is a rewarding and worthwhile opportunity that takes very little time and gives you an opportunity to assist those that are less fortunate and unable to cook for themselves due to age, recent hospitalization or a disability. Our drivers report how gratifying their delivery experience is, and how in many cases they are the only personal contact for the meal recipient each day.


