Welcome Back, Students of All Ages--Especially Adults!!

Do you know everything you need or want to know about God and living a life of faith?

On one hand, it is easy to say (along with Karl Barth) that we DO know all we need to know, and we even know this great truth in a simple song: "Jesus loves me, this I know..."

On the other hand, though, we realize that spiritual learning is a life-long process, and a part of life that, if neglected, leads to calcification of ideas and atrophy of one's heart and soul.

In special discernment meetings this summer, the Christian Education committee clarified its vision as offering to our congregation "spiritual formation through continuous learning and practice."

Let's break that down:

- "spiritual formation": a multi-faceted process of spiritual shaping and growth of the whole person, accomplished through diverse practices including study, service, prayer, discussion, worship, and more.
- "continuous learning": the acknowledgement that spiritual learning happens at all ages and stages of life, and that it happens throughout the week, not just on Sunday mornings.
- "[continuous] practice": like a doctor's "practice," spiritual formation is an on-going pursuit, not so much a thing to "get good at," but a way of life.

This week, our two on-going adult Sunday School classes resume.

- **Heirs Apparent** class: A small group characterized by intimacy and warmth born through many years of study together. The class is led by Curtis Reimer and features relaxed, pressure-free discussions that have attracted over the years a mix of ages and backgrounds. The group is currently watching and discussing episodes of "The Bible," a mini-series originally aired on the History Channel. *Anderson Conference Room, 9:15-10:15 a.m.*
- **The Forum**: Each Sunday's class is self-contained, so participants can pick and choose from the class selections, the collection of which provide a balanced offering of topics that are action-oriented, Bible-focused, contemplative, and/or discussion-rich. *Fellowship Hall, 9:15-10:15 a.m.*

This Sunday's Forum: "**The Act of Stillness: Exploring Sabbath for Real Life**" led by Kili Wenburg. Providing a foundation upon which all other acts of faith can build, Sabbath-observance is an exercise in humility and trust, the regular practice of which enables us to find rest, renewal, and delight in our busy lives. The class will draw upon the work of Walter Brueggemann and Wayne Muller and will include time for lecture, discussion, and the creation and sharing of strategies for incorporating Sabbath-observation into real life.
