## **CANADY'S CHRONICLE**

In our October 2 worship, the gospel reading included a request from the disciples asking Jesus to "increase our faith." I suggested that it is not up to Jesus to increase our faith but we have to find ways to increase our own faith. Two things I suggested for increasing our faith were praying and reading the Bible.

Praying? Whenever that is mentioned, people always comment, "but I don't know how to pray" or "how do you pray?" Well, there are no formulas that we pastors learned in seminary that we can share, but the apostle Paul has some suggestions.

First of all, "Rejoice in the Lord always." No matter what happens in our daily lives, we need to rejoice that we have a God who wants to be in relationship with us. We rejoice because God loves us as we are, not necessarily as we should be.

Second, Paul says, "pray honestly." I wonder if many Christians are afraid to pray. They don't want to treat God like some sugar daddy or mommy, so they hesitate to ask for "things" because it seems so greedy. "Let your requests be made known to God, and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Third, "thank you." Often we remember to pray when we think things are not going well. When we feel in need of God, we reach out with a prayer that almost sounds like we are begging. On the other hand, when all is right with the world and our life seems like we have all things in control, we forget that God is with us and helping us in all we do. Those can be the times when we forget to say, "thank you."

Fourth, "carry on." We know what is expected of us and how to do things. Paul tells us to "Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me." Carry on knowing that God has given you what you need to prosper each day.

Everyone needs a time to pray. To share life with God. To reach out. To rejoice in God always, to pray honestly, remembering to say thank you, and then to carry on each day with confidence. And remember, "The God of peace will be with you."

P.S. You learn all those things which Paul taught only by reading the Bible.

#### BE IT RESOLVED the minutes from the September meeting be approved.

#### Director of Education Infant & Youth Report - Stephanie Brader

- **Remodel of Junior High School Room -** Trustees will be working to improve the flooring and some minor remodeling of the room.
  - The committee discussed wall colors and furniture options for further improvements in the room. Furniture includes 3 activity tables, 20 chairs, and 2 couches.
  - o Additional needs would include a rug, fridge, art, lighting, and accent tables.
  - Stephanie has completed the Mona Searby Request Form for funding to not exceed \$6,000.
  - BE IT RESOLVED the CE Committee approves the Mona Searby Request Form for funding to purchase items for the renovation of the Junior High School Room. Costs to be estimated at \$6,000.

- **PreK-2nd Grade Curriculum Change:** The "Bible Studies for Life" curriculum we started using this August is not a good as we hoped it would be.
