

Introducing Reverend Greg Allen-Pickett and the Allen-Pickett Family

Rev. Greg Allen-Pickett grew up in Flagstaff, a college town in the mountains of northern Arizona. Greg was an active member of Federated Community Church where he sang in the choir, played handbells, participated in youth group, and was an acolyte and scripture reader. Greg was also an active member of the Boy Scout troop housed at his church and earned the rank of Eagle Scout. Growing up in Arizona, Greg had the opportunity to take a road trip to Mexico every other year with his church family. On these trips, he was struck by the poverty he encountered. Those experiences and the questions they generated were formative to his faith journey.

For his undergraduate degree Greg chose Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, WA; a university with a strong faith tradition whose motto was "Educating for lives of service." Greg graduated *cum laude* from PLU with a double major in Spanish and Political Science. These two degrees worked in tandem in order to understand the systemic issues underlying poverty as well as the human impact of poverty. Greg was also captain of the debate team and vice president of the student government association.

Greg met Jessica in college where they both rowed on the crew team. Jessica majored in secondary education with a focus in English. They were married in 2001 and moved to Ecuador where Greg was a Rotary Scholar, earning a Masters degree from a Catholic university and doing sustainable development projects with the Rotary Foundation while Jessica taught English as a second language.

After returning to the United States, Greg spent three years working in private industry as a manager for Alaska Airlines; four years working as an academic advisor and adjunct professor at the University of Denver; and three years working as the field operations manager for Healing Waters International, a faith-based organization that works on water purification projects in Latin America. Throughout these 10 years Greg also volunteered and worked part-time at Wellshire Presbyterian Church as a youth group leader and Sunday school teacher. During these years, Jessica worked as a high school English teacher, earned her Masters degree, and served as an assistant high school principal. In 2009, Greg and Jessica's daughter, Esther was born in Denver.

In August 2010, the Allen-Pickett family moved to Austin, TX where Greg attended seminary. During seminary, Greg served as a pulpit supply pastor for a church in Caldwell, TX and for a bilingual/multicultural church in Austin. In 2012, Greg was invited to work at the Presbyterian denominational offices in Louisville, KY as the General Manager of Presbyterian World Mission, helping

to support and oversee the mission efforts of the PC(USA). Greg served in that role for 3 ½ years before seeking a local church based pastoral roll and taking a call as the Director of Global Mission at First Presbyterian Church of Atlanta where he oversees all of the church's international mission efforts and serves on the pastoral team for worship leadership, preaching, and pastoral care.

He has developed leadership and management experience in for-profit and non-profit contexts and executive leadership experience at the Presbyterian Church (USA) denominational offices as well as congregational leadership experience in small, medium and large churches. In addition to preaching regularly, Greg has been a speaker at many conferences including the Haiti Connections Conference, Kenya Mission Network, Montreat and the New Wilmington Mission Conference. Greg also has native level fluency in Spanish and is trained in conflict resolution as a mediator. He has led more than 20 domestic and international mission trips and has a particular passion for seeing where God is at work in local communities and inspiring people to get involved in that work.

Jessica stayed home with Esther for the first few years after she was born, but has slowly been working her way back in to the world of education. She has taught preschool and volunteered at church, Esther's school, and at a private middle school for refugee girls. Most recently she has begun subbing and had the opportunity to serve as a special education teacher for our local school district in Decatur, GA. As Esther becomes more settled in school, Jessica continues to ease back into working in education.

Esther is a gregarious, curious and compassionate first-grader who loves science, nature, and swimming. The Allen-Pickett family also includes the goofy, sweet, and perfect-for-their-family-lab-Beagle-mix, Luna. They love spending time together as a family, swimming, playing board games, hiking, camping and appreciating the beauty and joy of God's creation.

Greg brings an executive leader's acumen, a manager's sensibilities and a pastor's heart to his participation in church leadership and God's mission. The Allen-Picketts are very excited about the prospect of joining the community at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings.



It is with great enthusiasm that the members of the Pastor Nominating *Committee (PNC)* have unanimously extended a call to Reverend Gregory Allen-Pickett and invited him to candidate as solo *pastor/head of staff* here at First Presbyterian Church! The PNC first *became acquainted* with Greg back in September when they received his Pastor Information Form (PIF) as a selfreferral. During the past several months, the PNC reviewed approximately 170 PIFs, listened to hours of sermons, and checked out numerous websites. Two other candidates were also interviewed during this process. Thou those other candidates were

An informal gathering providing congregation members an opportunity to meet Greg and Jessica will be held on January 28th in the Fellowship Hall at a time to be announced next week. Greg will lead the 10:30 worship service on January 29th followed by a congregation meeting with a vote taking place at that time. Please plan to attend these two very important events.



Is studying your Bible one of your New Year's resolutions?

Here are 12 steps to get you off to a great start!

(from an article in a recent *Horizons* magazine --the official publication of Presbyterian Women)

1. Gather resources: Bible, study Bible, dictionary and/or commentary, marking pencils, pen, and paper.

- 2. Read the passage in your favorite translation or version.
- 3. Read the passage again in a second Bible.
- 4. Read the passage a third time, and write down questions to explore.
- 5. Identify the type of literature the passage represents.
- 6. Notice what comes before and after the passage.
- 7. Read the notes in a study Bible.
- 8. Look up key words in the Bible dictionary.
- 9. Read the comments in a Bible commentary.
- 10. Reflect on what the writer was seeking to communicate.
- 11. Reflect on the meaning of the passage that applies to faith and life today.
- 12. Check to see if your questions were answered, and if not, search a little more.

**If this list feels overwhelming, just do what you can. When we seek to grow in our spiritual life, we are concerned only with faithful progress, not perfection!

GriefShare FAQ

Who should attend GriefShare? GriefShare is for people who have lost a loved one due to death. When someone is ready to attend GriefShare is a very personal matter. Some people are ready within a few weeks of the loss and for others it may be several months or even a couple of years.

What happens during a typical meeting? We talk about the past week's pages in the workbook and questions/thoughts that people may have from the previous week's video. After that, we watch the current week's video with discussion following. We end each session with prayer.

Do I have to talk during the meeting? No one is forced to talk, but you are encouraged to join in the conversation whenever you feel comfortable.

Do I have to write in the workbook? Writing in the booklet is not required as we realize that people have different learning styles. However, an outline for taking notes during the video is included in the booklet. You may find your notes to be very helpful when you refer back to the lessons.

Is GriefShare counseling? No. GriefShare is not counseling. Facilitators are present to encourage participation by introducing questions to generate conversation. If you are currently seeing a counselor, we recommend that you continue that. Through GriefShare you can be amazed at the healing that takes place by sharing with people in situations similar to yours.

What does it cost? There is no cost for attending or for the booklet. Sponsors are First St. Paul's Lutheran Church and Livingston Butler Volland Funeral Home & Cremation Center.

Is child care provided? Childcare can be provided if we are contacted in time to arrange for an attendant in our childcare area. Please give us a few days to arrange care for your child/children, by calling 402-463-1329.

Where is GriefShare held? GriefShare usually meets at The Youth & Family Ministry Building of First St. Paul's Lutheran Church, west door.

When can I begin? A winter session will begin Thursday, January 26, 2017. However, people not able to begin when a new series starts, can begin at any other Thursday evening.

What if I am just not sure about such a group being for me? You are encouraged to visit to "try it on." We understand if you decide that you are not ready for such a group. If you decide that the group experience is not for you at this time, you might consider signing up for the daily e-mails of encouragement from GriefShare. Just go to <u>www.griefshare.org</u>.
