Greetings and shalom from the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary in northeast Iowa where Rev. Dr. Silas Kessler met Ruth and where Si received his Master of Divinity degree a few decades ago. Zach Spurgeon, Logan Ellis and I are enjoying a class together on Young Adult Spiritual Formation during this two week "intensive" session which includes two weeks before and two weeks after our classes in Dubuque with online study assignments, interactive discussions, lectures, papers, readings, etc.

Zach and Logan are residential students and I am a distance online student which has allowed me to continue to serve the Harvard United Church of Christ as their solo pastor since April of 2009. The Spirit continues exciting work in Harvard, such as preparations for our 9th Annual Harvard UCC "Reach Out: Dare to Care" Youth Mission Trip to Camp Courageous this June just 45 minutes southwest of Dubuque. Many of the new spiritual activities that happen these days within the life and fellowship of Harvard UCC emanated via First Presbyterian, so thank you for your inspiration!

The emphasis of UDTS on spiritual formation, mission, evangelism and staying connected to Christ through daily worship, spiritual disciplines and class cohorts for distance students is beneficial to our development as pastors. This intensive will be my last one in Dubuque, so mixed, heartfelt emotions are certainly overflowing. After completing online classes this spring, there will be only one credit hour remaining before completion of the M.Div. degree, Supervised Practice Ministry (SPM), which I hope to complete through First Presbyterian, perhaps with a new called pastor as supervisor.

All PC(USA) candidates for ordination are also required to pass five ordination exams: Bible Content, Church Polity, Bible Exegesis, Worship and Sacraments and Theological Competence. So far I am four for four with only the Theology exam remaining this summer. The excellent pedagogy of Rev. Dr. David McCarthy and Rev. Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh during the completion of Lay Pastor requirements at Hastings College during the 2007-2008 school year has certainly enhanced the journey through UDTS. Special thanks also to Rev. Dr. Bill Nottage-Tacey and Kili Wenburg for their spiritual direction. More of you are encouraged to set up an appointment with Kili for spiritual direction and utilize the many other opportunities to grow closer to our Redeemer offered at First Presbyterian these days! Your prayers, encouragement and financial support are all very much appreciated.

The Four R's of Lectio Divina

Lectio (Reading)

Take your time and read the passage. Get a sense of what it is saying. Read the passage a second time. Listen for any words or phrases that strike you, and listen in your heart.

Meditatio (Reflecting)

Read the passage again, slowly. As you pause on the words or phrases that strike you, take time to consider what the word, phrase, or passage means, particularly in your life.

Oratio (Responding)

Read the passage again, slowly. Consider now how God has spoken to you in this passage and respond back to Him. You may want to consider how this passage is asking you to act differently.

Contemplatio (Remaining)


Now take some time to simply remain in the presence of God.
