

After working for the Jewish Federation in Boston from 1994 96, Jared decided to spend a year in Israel ... and never left. He spent 5 years studying the Jewish textual tradition in various yeshivas, and served as Program Director for 8 more. Since 1999 he has worked as an independent guide for families, faith communities, and multinarrative students in Israel and Palestine and as a faculty member at Jerusalem institutions that welcome Christian clergy from around the world to the Holy Land, Jared and his family live in Jerusalem. IRS recently announced the **new standard mileage rates for 2017**. Effective Jan. 1, 2017, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car, van, pickup or panel truck will be:

- \*53.5 cents per mile for business miles driven, down from 54 cents for 2016
- \*17 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes, down from 19 cents for 2016
- \*14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations
