## Dear Fellow Companions of the Way,

"I am about to do a new thing, do you not perceive it?" says the Lord." *Isaiah 43:19*. God is doing and will continue to do new things in our midst, in Hastings and around the world. When we are committed to a Risen Lord and Savior we can see lives changed in the name of and by the power of God in Jesus Christ. Having been blessed with the opportunity to play on the freshman basketball team at Duke and to practice with the varsity for four years (including two Final Four teams), I learned a lot about teamwork and making adjustments (half-time locker room and on the court) that I have long valued. Recently, I found some basketball statistics that caught my attention. Twenty years ago, professional basketball teams were making 48 percent of their shots. Statistics from the present NBA season show that teams are making less than 42 percent. What accounts for the drop? The statistics also show that teams are passing the ball fewer times per possession than they did twenty years ago. Passing the ball to a player who then makes a basket is called an "assist." Twenty years ago, the number of assists per game was 51.2. Now the number is down to 40.6.

The Church is where "two or three are gathered" in Christ's name, and the Church plays its best when it works together, shares the ball and listens to the coach, the teachings of the Risen Lord.

A very special welcome to **Michael Hull,** who has accepted our offer to lead us in music over the next few months. I pray that you will enjoy Michael's musical talent and presence in our midst until he leaves for LSU in August.

**Traci Boeve** was elected to an unexpired one year term on session this past Sunday. I welcome her leadership and I hope you will, too.

The greatest challenge before First Presbyterian Church (and so many American churches) is not losing sight of the Triune God. God is always calling for our attention. Are we open to the transforming presence of the Risen Christ, whose very first word to us in the oldest gospel was "repent," which means "turn around." Jesus is "the way and the truth and the life." ### **Eight Essential Qualities of Healthy Churches**

In his book *Natural Church Development*, Christian A. Schwarz discussed the findings of his study of 1,000 Protestant congregations in 32 countries. Schwarz identified eight quality characteristics found together in healthy congregations:

#### 1. Empowering Leadership

"Rather than handling the bulk of church responsibilities on their own, they invest the majority of their time in discipleship, delegation and multiplication."

#### 2. Gift-Oriented Leadership

"When Christians serve in their area of giftedness, they generally function less in their own strength and more in the power of the Holy Spirit."

#### 3. Passionate Spirituality

"The life of faith as a genuine relationship with Jesus Christ."

#### 4. Functional Structures

"Churches are liberated from being tradition-bound."

- 6. Holistic Small Groups
- 7. Need-Oriented Evangelism

#### 8. Loving Relationships

"Congregations are characterized by lots of hospitality and laughter."
