Dear Fellow Companions of the Way,

On October 3rd, 1863, President Abraham Lincoln wrote a Thanksgiving Proclamation that has become the pattern for our annual 4th Thursday of November holiday. The words of Lincoln's proclamation evoke the spirit of his time and ours:

"The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God."

I am struck by Lincoln's phrase "habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God." It is a reminder that we too often take for granted the blessings of life and come to view them as entitlements. We see ourselves as good people, therefore we assume we are due good treatment from a providential God. But as we read further into Lincoln's 1863 proclamation, he makes plain that the nation is also called to repentance for its warring ways and "perverseness and disobedience," imploring the nation not to forget those who have suffered the most, "the widows and orphans." Lincoln's call to thanksgiving is neither blind to the nation's faults nor sentimental about the nation's good fortune in enjoying "the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies."

At this Thanksgiving 2015, I cannot help but draw parallels to that honest call to repentance for our national "perverseness" while at the same time giving thanks for the blessings of a bountiful and good nation. There are certainly reasons to be dismayed by what happens or does not happen in public life today. Revelations about CIA drones involved in assassinations and civilian deaths called "collateral damage," violence that tears communities apart, denial of climate change that is threatening our world, wars that seem to have no end, a generation of young men and women who have given their lives in wars for uncertain political motivations. There is much about which we should be concerned, much "perverseness and disobedience" to repent.

But as President Lincoln noted, this is also a time to give thanks for the tremendous good that is in this nation, the good and abundant blessings to which we become *"habitually insensible."* For all the problems we face, we can still meet and overcome the challenges that face us. Thanksgiving can be a call to giving thanks for the

blessings of this nation. Our thanks to God, reminds us that we must work together as a nation until all people who are able to work can find meaningful work with a living wage, all people without shelter find housing, all who are sick receive proper medical care, and everyone in our world may live in peace. There is so much good for which to give thanks. And so much we have yet to do for what our reformed theology calls "the common good" so that all people may enjoy those blessings. A Blessed Thanksgiving!

TRANSITIONAL NOTES No. 15

In my eighteen interim pastorates I have seen countless surveys online and off-line that describe what people want and do not want in a pastor. However, in my observation between the time of a new pastor's arrival and the end of the first year, many of the expectations will have changed. That will occur because of the newly installed pastor's adjustments to the new church and the congregation's response to her or him.

The best survey I have seen of what a congregation really wants in a new pastor suggests three simple questions:

One, Is the person in the pulpit the same person we experience at the coffee shop? Is he or she a person of integrity and compassion? Will she or he walk a rocky road with us?

Two, Does he or she really love us? Three, Does he or she put Christ and the Church first in his or her life?

Now, reverse the questions and ask yourself: Are you authentic and compassionate with your pastor? Do you really love your pastor? and Do you put Christ and the Church first in

your life? - C.M.W.
