# **Langenberg Legacy Lesson Program**





Habit and obligation dictate many of our daily decisions. But when habits get boring and obligations feel like burdens, what motivations are we left with? Together, we'll pause to look more deeply at why we do what we do so that we can refresh our lives with intentionality, purpose, and joy!

Over the course of the Winter/Spring semester, Forum classes are addressing the "Why?" question from each of four different monthly vantage points, continuing with February's theme, Interacting With Others.

First, on Feb. 7, four brave individuals will be interviewed with regard to their faith: Jeff Howard, Gretchen Lainson, Irina Belikova-Erickson, and Kraig Lofquist. On the 14th, Ramez Habash, MD, a Jordanian-American, will help us explore interactions between enemies through a discussion of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Carlos Barcenas will join us on Feb. 21 from the Center for Rural Affairs as we consider our interactions with strangers-especially in the context of integrating immigrants into our community. And on the last Sunday of the month (each month), Brady Rhodes will facilitate discussions enabling us to expand and apply what we learned from previous classes.

# "Go and Learn" mission trip to Chiapas, Mexico

The Global Mission committee is sponsoring an adult mission trip to Chiapas, Mexico, October 28 to November 5<sup>th</sup>. This trip is organized by Frontera de Cristo (Café Justo), one of six Presbyterian Border Ministries, located in Agua Prieta, Sonora. Their trip is limited to 15 persons and is open to applicants from all 50 states, hence this will be a very small group from our church, and the trip will fill on a first come first serve basis. We have estimated the cost will be a minimum of \$2700 as airline fares have not been released yet. You need to remember that any travel outside the US is not risk free at this time, given the recent arrest of Chapo Guzman.
