For months now First Presbyterian has been involved in the process of finding a new pastor. In following that process there are three entities involved: church, presbytery, and candidate. All of those three are seeking the guidance of God's Holy Spirit in working toward finding that new pastor. If all are listening for that guidance, the process should move toward the end result.

Yesterday, April 3, that process brought the church to the place of meeting with and listening to Rev. Nathan Loudon. Following worship, after a time of questions and answers, a vote was taken to see if Nathan was the person to be our new pastor. I am assuming all that voted were seeking the guidance of God's Spirit and voted according to that guidance. The fact that some voted one way and others voted another does not make either group bad people. It means that some believed Nathan is what we need for a pastor and some did not. Either way, we have to honor the vote of our family members and not hold any kind of resentment toward them.

After the vote was taken (188 yes, 48 no) Nathan said that he would have to go home and pray about the call and let us know this week. Where we go from here is now up in the air, but again we will seek and trust God's guidance.

Dear First Presbyterian Church: I want to extend my greatest appreciation for the shirts that your congregation donated to us for the migrant farmworkers that will come to Hastings this summer. I also want the thank Denny Storer, he has been great to work with. The long-sleeve shirts are vital to protect the farmworkers from sun and pesticide exposure. They often travel to Nebraska on a school bus which limits the number of supplies that they can bring with them. This summer when the workers arrive, we will go out into the fields and teach them pesticide safety and heat stress safety. During these trainings we will hand out the shirts. Thank you so much for your support of SASA and interest in working with us to possibly fulfill some needs for our new shelter space as well as, perhaps our new youth/teen/women's center. For the shelter and for residents transitioning from that shelter, needs continue to be:

Microwave, shower curtains, shower rods, vacuum, twin sheet sets, buckets, mops, cleaning supplies, brushes, pillowcases, and comforters of varying size.

Items we keep on hand for families moving into the shelter:

Laundry soap pods (for easier distribution to families), dish & hand soap, toilet paper/ paper towels, new children's underwear/socks and women's underwear/ socks, sports bras sized large or xl, non-perishable foods, especially quick microwavable foods like easy mac, ravioli, ramen, soup; infant/ toddler snack foods, child snack foods that can be easily portioned or come as single-servings, juice boxes, etc. (we purchase fresh foods weekly when we have clients in residence, but if we shelter very late at night, this provides some quick meals in the event we can't get to the store).

If there are members of your congregation interested in getting involved with donating to our new Project ReStart Program, we would be open to developing a list for that space as well. Project ReStart is something we're very excited about. It is a multi-pronged program that is designed to unite survivors of violence with a supportive community of caring individuals through group programming that is both fun and interactive. Programming will include Zumba, art, sewing, walking groups, social hour, women's support group, children's support group, teen talk, access to our donation room and community resources. Programs will be open to survivors and community members free of charge. We would house this programming in the 2,000 sq foot office space we just acquired next door to our current office. Once renovations are underway, we'll be looking for volunteers to support the renovation (painting, minor demolition tasks, decorating, etc.). As the space nears completion we will be looking for a variety of furnishings (child specific or teen specific), various learning toys, bean-bag chairs, small child-sized tables, folding chairs, folding tables, etc. Some of these needs we'll be fleshing out as we get closer to opening the space.
