Over the course of the Winter/Spring semester, Forum classes are addressing the "Why?" question from each of four different monthly vantage points, continuing with May's theme, What do you see?

How do children benefit by attending worship?

- Our children are members of the covenant community (the church): Worship on Sunday morning is the
 primary activity the covenant community engages in together (Acts 2:42;Ephesians 10:24-25). Therefore, our
 children as members of this community should be included in this crucial aspect of covenantal life.
- Our children will be present in the midst of the means of grace: Our children benefit by being where the Word is preached (Romans 10:14), the sacraments are administered (Matthew 28:19-20), and corporate prayer is practiced (Acts 2:42-47).
- Our children will be present in the midst of the entire congregation: Our children benefit greatly by being in
 the presence of Christians of various ages. They are able to see that the faith of their parents is not a faith
 that they own alone, but is a faith that is important to all of these people who are gathered around them on
 Sunday morning. This only reinforces what Mom and Dad are modeling and teaching when they see this
 incredible gathering of people reading the Word together, praying together, confessing together, and singing
 together (Deuteronomy 31:9-13).
- Our children will be present with their parents: Worshipping together as a family helps to counter the
 current trend in our society of fragmenting our families.
- Our children will witness their parents worshipping: It is the Biblical role of parents to disciple their children
 in the faith (Deut. 6; Psalm 78; Eph. 6). What a benefit there is when children witness their mother or father
 singing with conviction, praying in reverence, listening intently to the sermon, or receiving the Lord's Supper
 in joy.

For those who don't already know us, we are Troop 200 and proud to be hosted, supported and chartered by the First Presbyterian Church here in Hastings, Nebraska. This has been a long-standing partnership that goes all the way back to 1936, and with mutual reverence and friendship it looks to continue to be a strong presence in Hastings for many years after I pass the torch to the next Scout master.

About us:

We currently have 13 boys, 4 patrols and a very enthusiastic, knowledgeable and dedicated council of leaders and parents. There is always room for more and we welcome and encourage all that want to join or volunteer your time. It is truly essential to keeping the scouting spirit alive.

Our young men strive to learn and advance skills that will help them help themselves in life, and teach the value of helping others along the way. We camp out (or gather for an indoor overnighter during hunting season) once a month. Then spend a week in the summer roughing it in a boy elected and BSA sponsored location. Focusing on outdoor activities such as fire starting and building, camping, cooking, first aid, emergency preparedness, personal fitness, aquatics, marksmanship, teamwork and more. Only a handful of dedicated scouts achieve this rank and Troop 200 has a picture of every one of them on the wall downstairs in the church's scout room!

You helped us raise \$600.00 for the healthy beginnings program.
