The 5th annual "Project Homeless Connect" will take place at First St. Paul's Lutheran Church on July 21, 2016, 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. The annual event brings together service agencies, schools, veterans organizations, churches, businesses, community support, and hundreds of volunteers to help homeless and nearly homeless individuals residing in Adams, Clay, Nuckolls, and Webster counties.
