Yesterday in worship I used the lectionary gospel reading to base my message. It is a familiar story which is known by people even outside the church. For we know the implications of the story are quite simple: if someone is in need, then followers of Jesus Christ are to help. But I think that meaning is understood by most people, not just those who follow Jesus.

I have preached so many times on this parable that I think I understand it. However, I must admit that I don't, in any way, understand what is going on in our country with the hate that has been built between two segments of our society—police and blacks and blacks and police. Luke's gospel, containing the parable of the good Samaritan, has Jesus talking about loving God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind, and loving your neighbor as you love yourself.

Where is the love? Where is the love? Oh, I am not naive enough to think that there is no reason for caution by either segment that currently is in battle, but the readiness to attack is quick on both sides. I don't know what it is like to be black in our American society where you feel you are being treated unfairly. Neither do I know what it is like to be a policeman who feels threatened by the actions of some of the black community. I do know that the troubles between these two segments of our country will not be resolved with hate. Jesus gave us directives to love, not as a gesture of nicety but as the only solution to make the world a great place to live.

It is easy for me to make judgments concerning the situations that have shaken our world recently because I am not directly involved, but there are happenings in my world every day that need God's love. Sometimes I take the lead to love and sometimes I "pass on the other side of the road." We all need to reach out, love more, and hate less.

Navigators (volunteers who assist a homeless guest in filling out a basic in-take form and navigate the guest throughout the process of accessing professional services offered at the event) are desperately needed for the 5th annual "Project Homeless Connect" scheduled to take place at First St. Paul's Lutheran Church on July 21, 2016, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. The annual event brings together service agencies, schools, veterans organizations, churches, businesses, community support, and hundreds of volunteers to help homeless and nearly homeless individuals residing in Adams, Clay, Nuckolls, and Webster counties. By providing critical care, services, and information, PHC helps recipients toward self-sufficiency. In 2015, 520 participants (315 adults, 205 children) received services.
