The Talking Table

"Hello. I am a table, nothing fancy, just a piece of wood on four legs. I'm pretty pleased with what I have to offer, though.

"When the kids in my family were all home, dinnertime was a real trip! There was lots of conversation and teaching manners. And occasionally Mom and Dad would even break into song. That REALLY embarrassed the children! But before every meal, they would all hold hands and thank God for the food and for being together as a family. I really liked being a part of that.

"Every day after school, I learned a lot of neat stuff because I was where the kids did their homework. Sometimes, after supper dishes were done, everybody sat around me and played games with cool names like Yahtzee, Sorry, Monopoly, and Chutes and Ladders.

"After my kids went away to school and then got married, it was really quiet for a while. Grown-up talk was more subdued. Then the grand kids came and we started all over again. It was a little different, though. The kids carried around different sizes of boxes that they poked at a lot with their fingers. They didn't want to talk as much, and it was harder to get them around me to play games. Once they got started, though, they seemed to have fun.

"I got to know the neighbors too. Sometimes the lady from the house next door would come over for a cup of coffee. They could set that coffee pot on me any time; it was my pleasure. Some new neighbors moved in and that was fun, too. My family invited lots of people over for a potluck dinner. I smelled lots of great new cooking. There were tamales and egg rolls and hummus and naan. Of course, I couldn't see, but everybody said the food was really tasty.

"Through the years I could feel myself getting older. One of my legs didn't work as good, but they put a folded up napkin under it and I didn't wobble so bad. My top was pretty scratched, but then my lady would rub on lemon oil and I would almost feel young again.

"One day something was really wrong. My man wasn't there in the morning and my lady was crying. Pretty soon people started bringing in lots of pans and dishes of food. Everyone that brought in food hugged my lady, and they cried, too. Pretty soon all my kids and their kids came and they all sat around me again. It was almost like the old days – almost.

"One day some men came with a truck and took me to some kind of store. I didn't know any of those tables and chairs, and I was pretty lonely. But then something really special happened. A very tall man and lady came into the store and said I was just what they needed. They told the store person they had come from Sudan and this table would be perfect for their family to sit around and play games and eat dinner and thank God for their food.

"I'm not done yet and I am a happy table."
