



Jared Goldfarb is an independent educator with 20 years experience. Now based in Jerusalem, he was born and raised in New Hampshire and studied at Brandeis University. After working for the Jewish Federation in Boston from 1994-96, Jared decided to spend a year in Israel ... and never left. He spent 5 years studying the Jewish textual tradition in various yeshivas, and served as Program Director for 8 more. Since 1999 he has worked as an independent guide for families, faith communities, and multi-narrative students in Israel and Palestine and as a faculty member at Jerusalem institutions that welcome Christian clergy from around the world to the Holy Land. Jared and his family live in Jerusalem.
