"Thank you!" to everyone who volunteered at Saturday's United Harvest mobile food pantry! Over 30,000 pounds of food was distributed to over 300 families in need. If you're thinking about volunteering, please join us for the next distribution: May 20. Volunteers are especially needed in the second shift.

Rolling right along...with your help, that is!

The United Harvest coordinating team has discovered that the most efficient way to collect and transport recipients' food is to utilize garden carts. Additional garden carts were purchased recently (at a sale price of \$58/cart), the cost of which is being shared by FPC and First United Methodist Church. This Sunday (April 23), the congregation will have the opportunity to contribute to the "cart fund" for the United Harvest mission. Any funds raised in excess of the cart cost will go directly to purchasing food for United Harvest. *Thank you!!*

Mission Committee delivered 150 long sleeve shirts for migrant workers to Jody at Proteus last week and we still have two months to go. Proteus assists over 500 migrants on farm visas every summer.

Deacons delivered 4 bags with 27 items to Hastings Food Pantry on Monday.
