#### 40 days of Easter

On Sunday, April 16, we celebrated Easter, and what a celebration it was! We had a glory-filled service with stunning music and we got to hear the familiar resurrection story again. I preached a sermon about the most hopeful image in the world: the empty tomb. And we proclaimed Christ has risen! I am so grateful for all who came and participated in the service.

We basked in the God's glory during that service and for the rest of the day. Maybe some of you even felt the Easter joy into the following week, I know that I did. Then for many of us, myself included, the realities of life and the world set in and the Easter celebration became a memory. But I want to remind all of us that Easter is a season, it lasts for 40 days! The Easter season commemorates the forty days the resurrected Jesus walked this earth before His Ascension back to heaven. Luke wrote, "After Christ's suffering, he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God." (Acts 1:3). How do we keep the Easter spirit going in this season?

We can start by reflecting on the stories of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances. We are doing that through the bible readings and sermons on Sunday mornings, but I would encourage you to do this yourself during this Easter season. Think about how Jesus presented himself to his disciples and others, and what that means for you today. Here is a listing of some of my favorite post-resurrection appearances for you to read, reflect on and study:

John 20:1-10: Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene outside the tomb

John 20:19-25: Jesus appears to the disciples, and then to "Doubting/Inquisitive Thomas"

Luke 24:13-35: Jesus appears to two disciples on the road to Emmaus

John 21:1-25: Jesus appears to 7 disciples fishing on the Sea of Galilee (and cooks them breakfast!)

Matthew 28:16-20: Jesus appears to the disciples and gives them "The Great Commission"

Acts 1:1-14: Jesus appears to the disciples, reasserts the "Great Commission" by saying, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth," and then ascends to heaven.

These are just a few of my favorite post-resurrection appearances that I offer for you to read and study during the season of Easter. My prayer for all of us is that we remember we are a resurrection people! Even though the joy of Easter Sunday may have faded a bit for us, let us remember that the resurrected Christ is with us every day of our lives, through the power of the Holy Spirit. And let us not forget our call to be witnesses to the love and grace of God to all the world as we continue to celebrate the 40 days of the Easter Season! Christ has risen indeed!

# Tribune Church to host 'tweaked' VBS for special needs children

First Presbyterian Church is offering a Vacation Bible School catering to children with special needs.

Modeled after its traditional VBS program, the new interdenominational class incorporates special education teachers, occupational therapists and others well familiar with special needs children to create an experience geared to meet youngsters where they're at while simultaneously setting the minds of their parents or caregivers at ease.

"We want the parents to feel comfortable bringing their children here," said Stephanie Brader, director of children's education at First Presbyterian. "A lot of children miss the opportunity to attend Vacation Bible School because their parents maybe don't feel comfortable leaving them with a lay volunteer, so we're bringing in specialized help to make them feel comfortable."

The idea of adding a special camp for special needs children was brought to Brader by longtime First Presbyterian lay member Jane Marsh, who has worked with special needs children for years. Marsh was inspired by a Vacation Bible School program she observed while volunteering at her daughter's church in Millard.

"She was just amazed and wanted to make that happen here," Brader said. "She contacted me and asked, 'Can we make this happen?' So we're trying it."

Following the same curriculum as the church's regular program, which this year runs from 2-5 p.m. May 22-26 at the church, the special needs version is from 9-11 a.m. May 22-25 and is tweaked to include specific tools that address the special needs of its participants, Brader said.

For starters, it is an hour shorter to accommodate those dealing with attention deficit issues.

Special scissors and other items will enable students with motor skill challenges to safely navigate arts and crafts projects. A sensory break area will give children who feel over-stimulated a chance to unwind when they feel overwhelmed.

"We're simplifying it," Brader said. "Otherwise, it's the same theme as the regular one. We want the kids to have the same experience but obviously make it so they feel comfortable and safe. The first year is always an experiment, but we want it to be impactful.

"My hope is to reach children who haven't had a chance to experience God's love in this way because of their differences. We're all children of God made in His image and need to understand that and be able to fulfill our faith needs."

#### May communion offerings will be to FPC's Open Table Sack Lunch Program.

FPC is scheduled to assemble and provide the Open Table lunches through the month of July again this year.

More than 5,000 sack lunches were assembled and almost 800 'special meals' prepared last year. 'Special meals' required Wednesday afternoon gatherings, meal preparation and storage, delivery to Catholic Social Services to return Thursday to warm and assemble to serve.

This 'above and beyond' effort was opted by the Mission Committee in consideration of those who eat sack lunches regularly.

The cost to fill the total need was \$5,318.82.

The Open Table Fund has a 2017 beginning balance of \$3,052.03, which is a great start!

Glory be to God that we are able to fill this need; let's do it again!

#### **Another Way to Support the Open Table:**

"Give Day is on May 11<sup>th</sup>. You can log onto www.givehastings.org from May 1st to May 11th. This is a wonderful opportunity to donate to the Open Table Sack Lunch Program, which was started in 2004 to help eradicate hunger in our community. In 2016, an average of 185 sack lunches per day were handed out to individuals and families in need. However, some days, we can give 200-300 lunches out. We rely on donations and volunteers to provide these at no cost to recipients. The money raised on *Give Day* allows us to add milk and juice to each lunch." —*Pam Taylor*, Board Member, OTSLP
