
Global Mission Committee Members delivered to Catholic Social Services 94 diapers on May 4th and 155 diapers on May 10th. Thank you for helping some of the most vulnerable in our community.

First Presbyterian Church Hastings remitted in May: \$1,448.00 to One Great Hour of Sharing, \$716.16 to FUMC for United Harvest Food Distribution, \$340.00 to Adams/Clay County ARC (Advocate for the Rights of Citizens), \$140.35 to PC(USA) Hunger Fund, \$84.00 to Hastings Food Pantry.

Donations for FPC's **Open Table Sack Lunch Program** are accepted throughout May. FPC is scheduled to assemble and provide the Open Table lunches throughout the month of July again this year. More than 5,000 sack lunches and almost 800 'special meals' were prepared last year. The cost to fill the total need last year was \$5,318.82.

The Open Table Fund has a 2017 beginning balance of \$3,052.03. \$1,618.00 was raised from communion offerings last week! The fund is still in need approximately \$650.00. Your donation is greatly appreciated.

Money and Possessions

Meeting 12:00-1:00 on Wednesdays, beginning June 14, the Summer Book Club will read and discuss Walter Brueggemann's book *Money and Possessions* under the leadership of Dr. Dan Deffenbaugh. *Order your copy from your favorite book seller today!*

"The Bible is rich with complex and diverse material on the topic of money and possessions. Indeed, a close look at many scriptural texts reveals that economics is a core preoccupation of the biblical tradition. In this new work, highly regarded preacher and scholar Walter Brueggemann explores the recurring theme of money and possessions in the Old and New Testaments. He proposes six theses concerning money and possessions in the Bible, observing their contradictory nature to the conventional wisdom and practice of both the ancient world and today's society. Brueggemann advises us to reassess the ways in which our society engages—or does not engage—questions of money and possessions as carriers of social possibility. He invites the church to move toward an alternative neighborly economy that is more consistent with the gospel we confess."

American Cancer Society Relay for Life of Adams County

Saturday, June 2, 6:00 - 11:00 PM Hastings High School Track

Relay for Life is the nationwide, signature event of the American Cancer Society. It is a community event in the fight against cancer, and as part of the ceremonies, volunteers and survivors line the track with luminaria (lighted

candles in weighted, white bags) inscribed with an individual's name. At sunset, everyone is invited to participate in the incredibly moving Luminaria Ceremony and observe a heart-felt-moment of silence as the candles are lit. Each luminaria is lit in honor of someone who has survived cancer or in memory of someone who has lost his or her battle to cancer. Donations for luminaria are \$10 each. All money goes to the American Cancer Society mission to help others Stay Well, Get Well, Finding Cures and Fight Back.
