### **Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:**

I want to share a few updates, thoughts and a couple of introductions with you. It has been a very busy summer for our beloved church! We have experienced a 40-50% increase in attendance this summer compared to the last three years, and the energy and excitement on Sunday mornings and throughout the week is joyful and contagious.

Not only do we have an increase in attendance and a boost in our spirits, but we are a church on the move! In addition to our incredible Vacation Bible Study that reached more than 70 children in Hastings, we piloted a Vacation Bible Study for children with special needs that was very successful. We also challenged ourselves to the "Summer of Service" and collectively logged over 1,300 hours of service to our church and community in the month of July. We sent a Go and Serve team to North Carolina, packed more than 4,000 sack lunches for the hungry in our community, and helped facilitate three United Harvest mobile food pantry distributions that distributed more than 100,000 pounds of food to our neighbors. I am so humbled and grateful to be serving such a compassionate and committed congregation!

Your staff, Session and committees were hard at work this summer too; I am excited to announce some staff additions. The Session and Trustees voted in May to approve a half-time associate pastor. This is a pilot program to explore if the church can afford and would benefit from additional pastoral staff. We convened a hiring committee made up of staff, session members, and church members with a vested interest in the success of our youth and college programs. The committee met, finalized a job description, and interviewed qualified candidates. We selected Rev. Damen Heitmann; you may know him as the Chaplain at Hastings College. His position at Hastings College was transitioned to half-time effective July 1, so he was available and wanted to come join the FPC family.

The main focus of this position will be High School Youth, College Ministry, and Mission (including Go and Serve). Damen will also help lead worship most weeks and will preach once a month. Because this is a half-time, one year contracted position, it did not require the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) search process or a congregational vote. Your Session, Personnel Committee, Trustees, and the hiring committee did a faithful job of vetting the position, ensuring the budget, and finding the right candidate. Our hope is that the church will experience growth in membership and budget and that this pilot program can become a permanent position. If that happens, we would put the position and candidate to a congregational vote. Damen's first day was August 16 and we introduced him to the congregation in worship in August 20. Please join me in welcoming Damen to the FPC family! On the next page you can read a brief bio of Damen.

We have also called Rev. Don Canady out of retirement into the role of "Parish Associate." This means Don will assist me, up to 5 hours per week, to help with the congregation's pastoral care needs like hospital visits, homebound visits, etc. I will still be doing most of these visits; I firmly believe that pastoral care is a vital part of the ministry that you have called me to as your senior pastor, and I find pastoral care a deeply gratifying part of my ministry at this church. However, with 600 members on our roles and more than 2/3 of them being active members, I want to ensure that our members are getting connected to the church when they have pastoral care needs, so Don will assist me with these visits.

I am excited for all the positive energy and forward momentum we are experiencing here at FPC. I believe that God is at work in and through this congregation, transforming our lives and our community. Thank you for all that you do and please continue to support our beloved church through your time, talents and resources, and your commitment to love your neighbors and be the hands and feet of Jesus inside and outside the wall of our church!

### Bio of Damen Heitmann, half-time Associate Pastor:

Originally from Victor, Iowa, Damen Wesley Heitmann is a 2005 graduate of Wartburg College. Following a year as an AmeriCorps VISTA member (a domestic volunteer program similar to Peace Corps), Damen attended United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities from which he graduated in 2009. He is an ordained member of the United Church of Christ and served for four years as the pastor at First United Church in Little Falls, Minnesota.

Damen came to Hastings, Nebraska in 2014 when he began serving as the Chaplain at Hastings College. In this capacity he leads weekly chapel services, works with student groups, coordinates special events and service trips, sends out silly emails and generally encourages people to consider their place in the universe. While

continuing at Hastings College, Damen began working at First Presbyterian Church in August of 2017 where he works with Senior High youth, preaches once a month, engages in college ministry, and helps to facilitate some mission activities. When not at the college, Damen spends his time keeping the cat (Baloney) from scratching the furniture, playing basketball, and doing a bit of writing.



### 3 Week Sermon Series: "It's Not Fair!"

Have you ever felt that life just isn't fair? We hear that phrase from kids a lot, but all people feel that way sometimes.

**Sunday, September 17:** "The math of forgiveness" God's math is not our math when it comes to forgiveness, we are called to forgive not seven, but seventy seven times! (Matthew 18:21-35)

Sunday, September 24: "A 'fair' wage" The parable of the same wage being given to workers who worked 10 hours and workers who worked 2 hours deeply offends our sense of "fairness." But in God's economy of grace, all are given the same. (Matthew 20:1-16)
