The school year has gotten off to an amazing start! Our Wednesday Night Live programming is full with 60+ people sharing dinner and fellowship every Wednesday, including 40-50 elementary aged children doing bible study and recreation together. Thank you to all the volunteers that make it happen.

More than 50 people of all ages came on our "Field Trip" to the Sachtleben Observatory where we observed the wonder of God's creation. Thanks again to Dr. Clyde Sachtleben.

On Sunday we had a "Blessing of the Pets" service in Alexander Park that drew more than 60 people and 35 animals including some people who aren't members, so this was a great outreach!

From your Parish Nurse:

Yoga has been practiced for over 5,000 years and is still widely recommended by physicians for a variety of reasons. There are over 100 different forms of yoga, but all include the three elements of performing a series of poses or postures, controlling breathing, and meditation or relaxation. This low-impact exercise can work every muscle group in the body and can be just as beneficial as aerobic exercise. Yoga does not require special equipment and can be modified for people of all ages and abilities.

By strengthening muscles, increasing balance and flexibility and enhancing breathing, every organ in the body can have improved function. As this occurs, immunity gets a boost and metabolism is more balanced. Yoga has been proven to decrease the risk of heart disease, osteoporosis, Alzheimer's, and Type 2 diabetes. It can also relieve some complications of chronic illnesses like asthma, arthritis, migraines, epilepsy, depression, menopause, and chronic pain.

In addition to physical benefits, yoga provides many psychological and lifestyle advantages as well. It has been shown to reduce stress and anxiety, enhance mood, and improve concentration and memory. By focusing on the mind-body connection during yoga, self-control and self-acceptance become easier in other areas of life.

FPC is excited to host a series of six free 45-minute yoga sessions on Wednesdays at 5:05 p.m. in the Annex gym, **beginning September 27**. Whether you are a yoga expert or a curious first-timer, please consider taking advantage of this opportunity to improve health and well-being. *Namaste!*

Consent Agenda: Motion and a second to approve the Consent Agenda. Upon a voice vote, motion carried.

Board Reports:

Deacons: No action items to bring forward. Communion was served during worship on July 2nd with Rev. Don Canady officiating and by Pastor Don at the retirement centers and to several homebound members on July 5th and 6th. Communion was served during worship on August 6th by Rev. Greg Allen-Pickett and at retirement homes and in homes on August 16th and 17th as well.

Trustees: No action items to bring forward. Trustees did approve the request by Hannah Jensen to move her piano studio to the Annex where she will teach private lessons. Mary Olsen made one correction to the Trustee minutes: it is the Archive Committee who was approved to spend \$750 for shelving.

Foundation: Three new members will be joining the Foundation Board in January; Bill Hermes, Melissa Karloff and Willy Kumer.

Motion and a second to receive the reports of the boards. Upon a voice vote, motion carried.

Clerk's Report: No action items to bring forward.

Reports from Committees of Session:

Christian Education: No action items to bring forward. Kick-off Sunday is August 20th; classrooms on the 2nd floor are being renovated.

Communication/Technology: No action items to bring forward.

Congregational Life: No action items to bring forward.

Global Mission/Social Witness: During a "Summer of Service" members turned in 1300+volunteer hours of service, well over the goal of 1000 hours. The committee is considering the possibility of an adult mission trip.

Memorial: Archive Committee is working and will purchase shelving units to store the items. The committee is also working on cleaning up old funds.

Personnel: No action items to bring forward.

PW: No action items to bring forward.

Scholarship: Did not meet.

Worship, Arts & Music: No action items to bring forward. Worship attendance during the summer months has growing and the committee has a number of events planned for fall. Beginning in September, there will be two services each Sunday. The 8:30 service will alternate between a contemplative and a contemporary service. There is a possibility that the Nebraska Brass will hold a concert in the sanctuary on Dec 3rd. Details are being finalized.

Moderator's Report: Request received to baptize Halligan (Hallie) Noelle Little on September 10, 2017. Parents are Andrew Richard Little and Laura Irene (Hoff) Little; grandparents are Susan and Neal Hoff. Motion and a second to accept the request; upon a voice vote, motion carried.

Rev Allen-Pickett distributed a statement of faith that was developed in response to signs of hate that had been posted in the community. It has been shared with other faith leaders in the community. Upon a motion and a second, to approve the statement and a plan to hold a press conference where other faith leaders are present; upon a voice vote, motion carried.

The Rev. Damen Heitmann has been offered and has accepted the position of Associate Pastor at FPC.

Pastor Greg proposed the position of Parish Associate Covenant with Rev. Don Canady using available funds for a trial period of one year. Motion and a second to approve the proposal; upon a voice vote, motion carried.

Pastor Greg explained the Strategic Planning/Visioning Process that will be conducted over the course of Fall 2017 and early winter 2018. The end result of that process will be a "5 Year Ministry and Mission Plan" for FPC that will center around our 150th anniversary in 2023.

Motion and a second and vote to adjourn the meeting with prayer.
