Happy New Year to our First Presbyterian Church family! I hope that each of you had a blessed holiday season. This was my first Advent and Christmas as your Pastor, and my family and I feel incredibly blessed to be a part of this community!

As 2018 begins and we think about what this year may hold in store for us, I would like to invite you deepen your commitment to what God is doing through First Presbyterian Church. A few opportunities to do that include:

- -Help run sound or cameras for our Sunday morning services. NO PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE IS NECESSARY! We are blessed with an incredible broadcast ministry on the radio and television as well as a great sound system that helps our church members to hear our worship. Come join the crew to help run sound or camera, we will train you! Contact Erik Nielsen or me for more information.
- -Join us on a mission trip. We will be doing a hurricane relief trip to Texas, March 18-24, with Hastings College Students. Adults of all ages are welcome to join this trip for an intergenerational experience! We also need High School youth and adult volunteers to join our Go and Serve trip to Camp Courageous, working with special needs students, July 14-21. - -Volunteer for Wednesday Night Live. Every Wednesday we serve 40-60 kids with bible study, recreation time, music, and a meal. Hear, Share, Live the Story!

JANUARY



In January, the Forum continues to explore the annual "Hear the Story; Share the Story; Live the Story!" theme, this month featuring stories of local, national, and world history.

First, Rev. Bill Nottage-Tacey, Pastor Emeritus, will offer an historical, Biblical, and theological reflection on responses to life's disasters, with reference to local fires as well as the fire that destroyed the Jerusalem Temple and the two towers fires of 9/11.

As a follow-up to our celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, we'll consider the Reformation's impact on Michelangelo, who painted the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel just prior to Luther's hanging of the 95 Theses. Later, when the shock waves of the Reformation were being felt in Rome, Michelangelo painted the altar wall of the Sistine Chapel. Comparison of these two works shows a marked change in the mood and spirit in the Church of Rome.

Finally, in observation of Martin Luther King, Jr., Day (January 15), we'll honor this famous preacher by exploring the role of churches in the 1960s Civil Rights movement. Churches have long felt the call to help shape a world in accordance with their understanding of God's will and to change unjust laws when they do not square with the moral universe. This talk is an historical examination of the roles churches played in the 1960s Civil Rights struggles in order to provide comparison with the role

churches currently play in the context of contemporary racial inequality and unrest.


