

#### **Houston Service Trip**

An inter-generational service trip is heading to Houston, Texas March 18-24. Open to both college students and members of First Presbyterian Church, we'll travel by van to Houston. Once there we will partner with the Texas Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church in their Hurricane Harvey recovery efforts. They have recovery efforts going in 15 different counties in the Houston area which we will assist as best we are able. We will be hosted at a

church and provided access to showers, a kitchen, and a place to sleep. Most likely that means air mattresses though there is a slight possibility that other arrangements could be made if necessary. Also, we will probably be participating in more physical labor kinds of tasks but we'll know more about what we'll be asked to do in the next couple of weeks. In order to cover costs and make a donation to our service partners we are asking folks to contribute \$200 to participate in the trip. There is scholarship funding available and the cost includes meals, gas, and funds for a fun day before we leave Houston. Some have already indicated their interest but if you are interested or have other questions please contact Pastor Damen.

#### Financial Peace University is underway, but there's still time to join!





#### **FPC Adult Mission in Motion**



Dust off your passports and prayerfully consider participating in an adult mission trip to Frontera de Cristo Bi-National Border Ministry between Douglas, AZ and Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico. This trip is being coordinated through four members of our mission committee who made this journey over a year ago. Frontera de Cristo is a partner with Café Justo which we sell in our Hands Around the World Store. This initial announcement is to let you know we are planning a shorter version of our trip from October 20<sup>th</sup> to October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at an estimated cost of \$800 which includes a flight from Grand Island to Tucson. There may be some financial assistance available. We will continue to add information about the ministry, registration, costs and schedules each week.

Working with our partners, Frontera de Cristo engages in six areas of ministry including: church development, health ministry, family ministry, mission education, the Just Trade Center and community development with the New Hope Community Center. A great deal of energy and prayer is directed towards mission education, working with mission delegations across borders to build relationships and understanding and witness to the power of the gospel to tear down walls that divide humankind. Mission teams come to be in mutual mission with their Mexican brothers and sisters, sharing their gifts and talents as well as receiving.







Help the young women of Pine Ridge Reservation.

Beginning on Women's Sunday, March 4 a special project has come to our attention. Many teenage girls on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, SD are missing up to one week of school each month because they can not afford Sanitary Supplies.

You can help us and these young ladies. A group of FPC women along with the Presbyterian Women's Committee are asking for the congregation to either donate supplies or help with money to purchase products.

We will be doing an ongoing drive for feminine hygiene products for the young women living on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

You can buy the products and bring them to the church or you can donate money and they will buy the products in bulk to be shipped to the reservation.

The supplies can be placed in Memorial Room starting March 4 and continuing in the future by leaving them in the office or leave a check made out to First Presbyterian Church with a note on the memo line Pine Ridge.

#### About World Day of Prayer

Since the nineteenth century, Christian women in the United States and Canada have initiated cooperative activities in many areas of concern for women and children, recognizing the critical role of prayer in mission work and their call to promote world peace through worldwide mission work. The first organized

"day of prayer for the world" was held in Canada on January 1920. The United States soon followed on February 20, 1920.

Now, hundreds of thousands of women (and men, youth, and children) from around the world and in every region gather to collectively worship on the first Friday in March. Each year, a different country services as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service and other materials. Women of that country's national WDP committee interpret scripture within their cultural context and prepare a worship service; women around the world lead the services.

World Day of Prayer is supported by sacrificial and benevolent mission offerings given by individuals through these annual services. Each of the 170 countries celebrating World Day of Prayer has an ecumenical committee of women representing many cultures, races and faith traditions. Each country's committee is responsible for determining the use of the offering as it relates to the theme for each year. Offering grants are made to women and children's groups in each country.


"A heri grontapu di Gado meki bun doro, dóro!

In the beginning, God created our world from chaos. And everything that was created found its place in creation. All were related to each otherearth and light, waters and sky, tree seeds and living creatures, humankind and God. None could exist without the other, and the source of all was God. There was goodness in that integrated system. And essential to that goodness was the charge to care for creation. was the charge to care for creation.

This year, the women of the World Day of Prayer (WDP) Committee of Suriname call us to worship with the words: "All God's creation is very good!" We are invited to learn about Suriname's history and rich cultural diversity. The women share their stories of intergenerational wisdom, traditions, and experiences of God's profound love. The focus is on Genesis 1, the story of creation. They remind us that we are caretakers of God's creation! Through their Bible study and worship service, they invite us to explore issues of climate change, natural disasters, human abuse of the environment-all affecting God's good creation and God's people. They invite us to explore these issues both in the Suriname context and around the world, and to prayerfully consider our response in light of God's generosity.

WDP's guiding principles affirm that "prayer is rooted in listening to God and to one another." Through the worship service, we listen to the people of Suriname. They take us to their communities and through their concerns. Their everyday life is woven into their prayers. They pray for creation and for us as we strive to live into our commitment to care for God's creation. They invite us to consider the words "A heri grontapu di Gado neki bun doro, dóro!" ("All God's creation is very good!"). They invite us to follow prayer with action.

WDP's motto, "Informed prayer leads to prayerful action," affirms that prayer and action are inseparable and that both have immeasurable influence. As we observe WDP 2018, millions of God's immeasurable influence. As we observe WDP 2018, millions of God's people are being affected by human abuse of God's creation—the earth, its creatures, God's people. We encourage you to begin thinking about actions that you can take to heal and protect God's creation. Throughout the service, the women name ways we can care for the earth and its people. Let us walk in faith and prayerful action!
