HUMANITIES NEBRASKA

The U.S. was the first country in history founded not by military conquest or religious fervor, but by a small group of men who convinced the majority of people it should exist. The founding fathers understood the rules of effective public relations campaigns, and journalists were always integral to the process, but politics changed in the 1930s when two individuals met by chance, formed a PR firm, and invented the modern negative media campaign. Barry Anderson, retired professor of journalism and former radio and television producer, will share the fascinating story of the birth of the tactics evident today in every American election.
