An inter-generational service trip is heading to Houston, Texas March 18-24. Open to both college students and members of First Presbyterian Church, we'll travel by van to Houston. Once there we will partner with the Texas Annual Conference of the **United Methodist** Church in their **Hurricane Harvey** recovery efforts. They have recovery efforts going in 15 different counties in the Houston area which we

will assist as best we are able. We will be hosted at a church and provided access to showers, a kitchen, and a place to sleep. Most likely that means air mattresses though there is a slight possibility that other arrangements could be made if necessary. Also, we will probably be participating in more physical labor kinds of tasks but we'll know more about what we'll be asked to do in the next couple of weeks. In order to cover costs and make a donation to our service partners we are asking folks to contribute \$200 to participate in the trip. There is scholarship funding available and the cost includes meals, gas, and funds for a fun day before we leave Houston. United Harvest: Offering Food and Raising Awareness

As we prepare for Saturday's United Harvest distribution, please remember three things:

- 1. Food is available, no questions asked, to anyone in need. Bring boxes or bags to receive.
- 2. Volunteers are needed! Last month, we were short on volunteers. Most are needed during the primary shift (9:30-12:00), but many are also needed for the clean-up shift (12:00-2:00). Your help is appreciated!!
- 3. United Harvest distributions are a venue for spiritual and personal growth. Please consider the following thoughts, shared with us by a friend from FUMC.

"Language and how we use it matters, especially within the Christian community where the context is transforming lives. Language is constantly changing with the times. That should lead us to challenge and listen to each other because what has been normative in the past may not be acceptable today. Communication styles likely vary widely among the diverse group of volunteers and guests who make up the United Harvest ministry. Thus, with patience and awareness, we should all strive to avoid language which exhibits racial bias, labels people by what they lack, or indicates gender-based judgments or preconceptions. Such language would demonstrate failure to love our neighbor. An example from my educational background in the scientific arena fifty years ago illustrates how what once was normative is now considered sexist. The statement "A scientist should carefully document his experiments" would today more likely be written as "Scientists should document their experiments." When we label someone as "poor," do we emphasize their financial poverty and dismiss their value? When native English speakers hear Spanish being spoken locally, do we respond with curiosity or with judgment? In all matters which threaten to divide us—race, language, gender, financial standing, etc.—may we use language that instead brings to light the unity of Spirit which we have through God who created us all."

Frontera de Cristo is a Presbyterian border ministry located in the sister cities of Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico and Douglas, Arizona. Frontera joins with community partners in six areas of border ministry including: church development, health ministry, family ministry, mission education, the Just Trade Center and community development with the New Hope Community Center.

This trip is being coordinated by four members of our mission committee who made this life changing journey over a year ago. Denny Storer, Jan Ham, Pam Lay, Jeni Howard and Greg Allen Pickett will be glad to answer questions and share their experiences of Frontera de Cristo. There are so many blessings from this type of mission experience, but two of the most important are the spiritual growth and relationships developed with people working-living close to the borders on all sides; as well as, the relationships built with our fellow travelers. We are hoping to find about 12 adults interested in going. We are looking at an estimated cost of \$800 which includes a flight from Grand Island to Tucson. It also includes housing and most meals. There may be some financial assistance available. We will continue to add information about the ministry, registration, costs and schedules each week. Our adult mission trip to Frontera is a "trip of discovery" -- we go to gather information, share stories, experience new stories, and bring the stories back to interpret to all. We will also learn more about how the Café Justo we sell in our Hands Around the World Store is such an important part of that story.

Help the young women of Pine Ridge Reservation.

Beginning on Women's Sunday, March 4 a special project has come to our attention. Many teenage girls on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation, SD are missing up to one week of school each month because they can not afford Sanitary Supplies.

You can help us and these young ladies. A group of FPC women along with the Presbyterian Women's Committee are asking for the congregation to either donate supplies or help with money to purchase products.

We will be doing an ongoing drive for feminine hygiene products for the young women living on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

You can buy the products and bring them to the church or you can donate money and they will buy the products in bulk to be shipped to the reservation.

The supplies can be placed in Memorial Room starting March 4 and continuing in the future by leaving them in the office or leave a check made out to First Presbyterian Church with a note on the memo line Pine Ridge.
