May Friendship Day Celebration "May Friendship Day 2018: Reaching for Wholeness"

The Church Women United Celebration called May Friendship Day (MFD) is an annual event celebrated by CWU nationwide.

The overall theme for the 2018 celebrations is "God's Presence." taken from Colossians 1:17 - "And God is before all things and in and through God the universe is a harmonious whole." May Friendship Day focuses on our gratitude for God's presence in all things and especially as we respond to human needs. Childhood hunger is one of the most important needs at the present time, and that is our focus in this program.

May Friendship Day began in May 1933 when two women's groups, meeting at separate luncheons, focused on children's health and the children of migrant families. The first luncheon was held by the Women's Council for Home Missions in New York City. The second, called "Dedication Day," was sponsored by the National Council of Federated Church Women and advocated church women's greater dedication to the social concerns of local communities.

In 1939 the groups merged to become the National Council of Church Women. The organization soon held its first annual observance of a day "to strengthen a growing sense of unity, the joy of Christian fellowship, and the power of Christianity in the way of need." In 1945 the observance officially became May Friendship Day, and in 1999 Church Women United changed the name to May Friendship Day. This year's May Friendship Day centers on the role of Christian women in addressing the social needs of hunger and poverty.

Each Mother's Day, the Presbyterian Women sell **Mother's Day cards** for a suggested offering of \$10 each. The proceeds go to a mission to help mothers. Usually that mission has been overseas, but this year we are keeping it local. The proceeds will go to the *Sixpence Early Learning Fund* here in

Hastings. More than 30,000 of Nebraska's infants and toddlers are at risk of arriving at their first day of kindergarten developmentally unprepared to learn and thrive. Sixpence is changing the odds in their favor. The *Sixpence Early Learning Fund* is Nebraska's signature effort to put our state's youngest and most vulnerable children on the path to success in school and life. Sixpence promotes high-quality early care and learning opportunities that help parents guide the healthy development of their infants and toddlers. Women from our church will be selling cards Sunday, April 29, and Sunday, May 6 in the Memorial Room. Cards will also be available for purchase in the church office Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m. -4:30 p.m. thru the week of April 30. Please stop by and help us help the young women of Hastings.

April is National Donate Life Month. As of April 25, 115,000 people are awaiting a lifesaving transplant, another person is added to the waiting list every 10 minutes, 22 people die each day because they did not receive the organ they need in time, and one organ, eye and tissue donor can save and heal more than 75 lives. 95% of Americans are in favor of being a donor but only 54% are registered.
