Fried chicken, drinks, and tableware will be provided. Please bring a side to share.



Coming Soon: FPC Summer Book Club

Do you know anyone in the so-called "Church Alumni Association," that growing organization filled with former church members who are no longer motivated and inspired by traditional explanations of spiritual truth?

Or do you sometimes yourself feel like a "believer in exile," a spiritual seeker struggling to straddle two worlds, one with modern concepts, symbols, and science, and another with confusing creeds, unmoving liturgies, and archaic language?

If these questions, both framed by phrases coined by Episcopalian Bishop John Shelby Spong, trigger either a positive response or serious curiosity, consider participating in FPC's Summer Book Club as it discusses Spong's new book Unbelievable: Why Neither Ancient Creeds Nor the Reformation Can Produce a Living Faith Today.

With the boldness of a modern day Martin Luther, Bishop Spong calls for a new reformation within the church, posting twelve challenging theses ranging from the need to reimagine the nature of God, to why original sin is an inadequate way to understand human behavior, to how resurrection has more to do with spiritual wholeness than unthinkable biology.

Facilitated by John Harrington, this discussion group will meet each Wednesday noon, June 6 - July 18 in the Anderson Conference Room. Feel free to bring a sack lunch. Participants should obtain a copy of the book through their preferred book outlet.

The *Sixpence Early Learning Fund* is Nebraska's signature effort to put our state's youngest and most vulnerable children on the path to success in school and life. Sixpence promotes high-quality early care and learning opportunities that help parents guide the healthy development of their infants and toddlers.

American Cancer Society Relay for Life of Adams County Friday, June 1, 6:00 PM – 11:00 PM Hastings High School Track

Relay for Life is the nationwide, signature event of the American Cancer Society. It is a community event in the fight against cancer, and as part of the ceremonies, volunteers and survivors line the track with luminaria (lighted candles in weighted, white bags)

inscribed with an individual's name. At sunset, everyone is invited to participate in the incredibly moving Luminaria Ceremony and observe a heartfelt moment of silence as the candles are lit. Each luminaria is lit in honor of someone who has survived cancer or in memory of someone who has lost his or her battle to cancer. Donations for luminaria are \$10 each. All money goes to the American Cancer Society mission to help others Stay Well, Get Well, Finding Cures and Fight Back. First Presbyterian Church Team again will be participating this year. FPC: Exploring God's Mission Through Partnership "Building relationships and understanding across borders."





Fact Sheet What?

FPC Hastings is sponsoring an adult exchange to one of our mission partners, Frontera de Cristo from October 20th to October 26th, 2018. Frontera de Cristo is a Bi-National Presbyterian Border Ministry.

The following is directly from their excellent website at fronteradecristo.org

Working with our partners, Frontera de Cristo engages in six areas of ministry including: church development, health ministry, family ministry, mission education, the Just Trade Center, and community development with the New Hope Community Center. A great deal of energy and prayer is directed towards mission education, working with mission delegations across borders to build relationships and understanding, and witness to the power of the gospel to tear down walls that divide humankind. Mission teams come to be in mutual mission with their Mexican brothers and sisters, sharing their gifts and talents as well as receiving.

Where?

Frontera de Cristo is a Bi-National Border Ministry between Douglas, AZ and Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico. Our mission group will spend some time in Douglas, but most of the week will be spent in Agua Prieta.

When, How and How Much?

Plans are to depart from the Grand Island Airport for Tucson, AZ on Saturday, October 20th. A Frontera de Cristo van will pick us up in Tucson and transport us

to Douglas and Agua Prieta. We will fly back to Grand Island from Tucson on Friday, October 26th. The estimated cost is approximately \$800 to \$900 including the flight. If you prefer to drive and have more time, arrangements could be made to meet in Douglas. This cost includes food and housing while we are there. We will be housed in homes, a community center, or churches during our stay.

Activities:

Primary goals for exchange delegates include:

- Forming relationships between U.S. and Mexican brothers and sisters.
- Building understanding of our spiritual, political and economic connections across borders
- Understanding the realities of life on the border
- Sharing talents or gifts of participants; as well as, discovering new abilities.
- Building knowledge of Frontera de Cristo to interpret their mission and ministry to others.

Activities may include visits, interactions and services at a migrant resource center, migrant shelter, the border wall, border patrol, Sonoran Desert, a Maquiladora, Just Trade Center, drug/alcohol rehab center, community gardens, Lily of the Valley Church, Café Justo roasting facility and Café Y Mas coffee shop.

Who?

Twelve adults who are interested in making this life changing journey and building understanding and relationships with our brothers and sisters across the border, and with each other. Those participating should be able to handle moderate amounts of walking. An official ID is necessary for border crossing. Passports may serve as this identification, but are not necessarily required for this trip.

Deadlines and Application

The deadline for filling out the attached application is June 1st, 2018. A \$200 deposit would be required at that time. Again some of the activities and opportunities could be tailored to the skills and interests of the participants, so the sooner we know who is coming, the better. The final non-refundable payment will be due July 1st to book the flight. Please consider joining us.

Volunteers Needed

Project Homeless Connect is a one-day, all-volunteer led event to connect homeless, near homeless, or those who are struggling to needed resources and services, and to raise public awareness of homelessness and the needs of those who often may go unseen. The mission of PHC is about welcoming all as neighbors into the life of the community, changing the way resources are accessed, and offering positive results for those in need.

Project Homeless Connect-Hastings will be 10-4pm, Thursday, June 28 at 1st St Paul's Lutheran. Last year we served 428 guests, including 287 children. This year we anticipate serving over 450.

Volunteers are the foundation of our event! Last year we had 200₊ volunteers; we anticipate needing 225 for this year. May communion offerings will be donated to the Open Table Sack Lunch Program.

FPC is scheduled to assemble and provide the Open Table lunches through the month of July again this year. More than 5,000 sack lunches were assembled and almost 800 'special meals' prepared last year.

'Special meals' required Wednesday afternoon gatherings, meal preparation and storage, delivery to Catholic Social Services to return Thursday to warm and assemble to serve. This 'above and beyond' effort was opted by the Mission Committee in consideration of those who eat sack lunches regularly.

The cost to fill the total need was \$4,727.40. The Open Table Fund has a 2018 beginning balance of \$301.64. Glory be to God that we are able to fill this need; let's do it again! Your offering makes the difference, thank you!
