Or do you sometimes yourself feel like a "believer in exile," a spiritual seeker struggling to straddle two worlds, one with modern concepts, symbols, and science, and another with confusing creeds, unmoving liturgies, and archaic language?

If these questions, both framed by phrases coined by Episcopalian Bishop John Shelby Spong, trigger either a positive response or serious curiosity, consider participating in FPC's Summer Book Club as it discusses Spong's new book Unbelievable: Why Neither Ancient Creeds Nor the Reformation Can Produce a Living Faith Today. With the boldness of a modern day Martin Luther, Bishop Spong calls for a new reformation within the church, posting twelve challenging theses ranging from the need to reimagine the nature of God, to why original sin is an inadequate way to understand human behavior, to how resurrection has more to do with spiritual wholeness than unthinkable biology.

Facilitated by John Harrington, this discussion group will meet each Wednesday noon, June 6 - July 18 in the Parlor. Feel free to bring a sack lunch. Participants should obtain a copy of the book through their preferred book outlet.

Relay for Life is the nationwide, signature event of the American Cancer Society. It is a community event in the fight against cancer, and as part of the ceremonies, volunteers and survivors line the track with luminaria (lighted candles in weighted, white bags) inscribed with

an individual's name. At sunset, everyone is invited to participate in the incredibly moving Luminaria Ceremony and observe a heartfelt moment of silence as the candles are lit. Each luminaria is lit in honor of someone who has survived cancer or in memory of someone who has lost his or her battle to cancer. Donations for luminaria are \$10 each. All money goes to the American Cancer Society mission to help others Stay Well, Get Well, Finding Cures and Fight Back. First Presbyterian Church Team again will be participating this year. HOW TO TRANSFER GIFTS OF STOCK IN THREE EASY STEPS

The First Presbyterian Church of Hastings, NE currently has an account with TD Ameritrade that receives all stock(s) for immediate liquidation. This account is served by TD Ameritrade Representative Douglas Oakeson of Oakeson Steiner Wealth & Retirement. If your stock(s) is held in certificate form please contact Doug at 402-461-3000 to have him assist you in the handling of your gift. If your stock(s) is held in a brokerage account at another financial institution, you need to authorize your financial institution to transfer that stock(s) to TD Ameritrade. Here is how:

1. Write a short "authorization letter" addressed to your financial institution or stockbroker that is holding your stock. Your financial institution will not transfer stock without your written authorization. Please use the following example to write your letter:

- 2. Contact your financial institution to see if they will accept a fax copy of your letter or if it is necessary to mail the original. Please confirm that they receive the letter.
- 3. Contact the Administrator at First Presbyterian Church to let him or her know that your stock is being transferred. He or she will contact Doug Oakeson to alert him to expect the transfer.

First Presbyterian Church will be notified by Mr. Oakeson when the stock has been transferred. The church will authorize TD Ameritrade to sell the stock(s) immediately. You will receive a confirmation from First Presbyterian Church.
