**Project Homeless Connect** is a one-day, all-volunteer led event to connect homeless, near homeless, or those who are struggling to needed resources and services, and to raise public awareness of homelessness and the needs of those who often may go unseen. *Project Homeless Connect-Hastings* will be 10-4pm, Thursday, June 28 at 1st St Paul's Lutheran. Last year we served 428 guests, including 287 children. This year we anticipate serving over 450. Volunteers are the foundation of our event! Last year we had 200+ volunteers; we anticipate needing 225 for this year. #### **CLEANING OUT YOUR CLOSETS??**


