NOTABLE NOTES FROM...

PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I am still basking in the glow of our worship services on the first Sunday of the season of Advent. We were blessed with incredible music to set the tone of anticipation and hope in this season.

Our 8:30 contemplative Taize-style service was accompanied by members of our middle school and high school choir, Peter Lainson on guitar, Sarah Wolf on flute, Mary Plock on piano and Rev. Dr. David McCarthy helping to lead the singing.

Our 10:30 service started with a congregational hymn sing. People called out Advent and Christmas hymns and the congregation gloriously sang the first verse of the hymns. (We will be doing this again before our worship services on December 16 and 23, too, so come early!) The prelude was a stunning flute solo by Sarah Wolf called *Avinu Malkenu*, based on a Jewish prayer described as "the oldest and most moving of all the litanies of the Jewish Year." Following that prelude we had an introit offered by our 1st and 2nd Grade Handbell Choir. As a congregation, we sang two beautiful hymns as part of our Advent Wreath candle lighting.

For our choral anthem, the Praise and Alleluia elementary school choirs shared a delightful piece called *I Would Have Been Surprised, Too*, where the singers expressed what they might have felt had they been in Bethlehem when Jesus was born. As part of the sermon, our Chancel Choir sang the opening piece from the cantata, *Small Dancing Light*. This song reminded all of us of the advent themes of hope, peace, joy, and love; and that the small dancing light will be dawning in the midst of darkness. The entire cantata will be sung at our 10:30am worship service on Sunday, December 9th.

During the offering, our 3rd-5th Grade Handbell Choir serenaded us with a moving rendition of *Away in a Manger* that incorporated both chimes and handbells. We were blessed with a beautiful medley of piano music during the serving of communion, arranged and played by our pianist Mary Plock. Finally our Preschool and Kindergarten Handbell Choir closed our service with their own rendition of *Away in a Manger*.

I share all of this with you for a few of reasons. First, to remind ourselves as a community how blessed we are by our music program. We have incredible leaders and volunteers in the program who strive to help us create a worship experience that is beautiful and puts our focus on God. The level of participation by children of all ages, youth, and adults is quite remarkable in this day and age, and speaks to an incredible legacy as well as a continued commitment to make music part of our faith journey. And I want to remind you that all are welcome to join our choirs and handbell choirs, so please consider doing so, no matter your age or musical ability.

Second, I share this to remind you that we are now livestreaming our services on the internet, and also archiving them. (While we do the livestreaming and posting of the services on our Facebook page, you are not required to have a Facebook account to see them.)

Finally, I hope that the music at our worship services provides you some joy and encouragement, particularly in this season of Advent. In the four weeks leading up to Christmas, we focus on the themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. Those themes are all woven through the music we share during this season. My hope is that your spirit is lifted as you engage with the music during this time, and that it helps to prepare your heart and mind to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ 2000 years ago while together we proclaim "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel."
