LIGHTING OF THE THIRD ADVENT CANDLE

(The tradition of First Presbyterian Church is to invite a family to light the Advent candle. Our Christian understanding of family includes all sisters and brothers in Christ who live in fellowship together and take care of one another. This morning, we invite members of our FPC family: Dale Behrens, Rich McKenzie, Jim Wenburg, and John Northrop to light the third Advent candle.)

This is the third Sunday in Advent. Today, we light two purple candles and the pink candle. These are the candle of hope, peace, and joy.

"And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name."

Today we remember Mary, innocent and powerful, sacred and scared, worried and waiting. She sings boldly when she might be meek; she bears her role in history with the confidence of a warrior; she is the beginning of a mighty revolution as the proud are brought down and the lowly lifted up.

Today we give thanks for the "Marys" among us; unintended pioneers determined to do as God asks; fearless and fearfully stepping out in faith, and beckoning us to do the same.

On this third Sunday of Advent, we light this candle as a symbol of Mary, mother of God, bearer of the Way. Even in the midst of the unknown, with Mary we proclaim: Come Hope! Come Peace! Come Joy!

Youth Special Attendance Recognition for November


