Mission Statements and Strategic Plans

On Sunday I preached a sermon about the story of Jesus reading the scroll in the synagogue that we find in Luke 4:14-21. He quotes this messianic prophecy from Isaiah 61:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.

I referred to this as Jesus' "Mission Statement" and reminded the congregation that Jesus has passed this work on to us as the Body of Christ. Then I mentioned two other verses that I think are particularly compelling to think about as mission statements for disciples of Jesus Christ:

The Great Commission from Matthew 28: Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you.

And the Greatest Commandment, which we find a version of in three of the gospels: *Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And love your neighbor as yourself.*

Between Luke 4, the Great Commission and the Greatest Commandment, we are blessed with some very clear marching orders for what it means to be disciples of Jesus Christ.

Since August, we have been working on developing a strategic plan for First Presbyterian Church. Our goal is to put together a plan that will give us direction and will shape the work we do for the next five years. Part of the strategic planning process involved studying and revising our church's own mission statement. We received feedback about what makes First Presbyterian Church the beloved community it is and how it is a force for good in the world. We also spent time reading and studying the bible and in prayer.

Below is the mission statement that we came up with, which is now helping to drive our strategic planning process.

Welcoming all to live the love of God and the love of neighbor as we seek to transform ourselves, our community, and our world through service, worship, prayer, education and fellowship.

We hope to complete and share the strategic plan by March and will use it to help focus our work into the future. My prayer is that you see reflections of Luke 4, the Great Commission and the Greatest Commandment in this revised mission statement, and that you can help our church faithfully enact this mission in big and small ways. I remain deeply blessed and humbled to be your pastor and to help lead our church to fulfill the mission that God has placed on us.
