January Communion Offering goes to Healthy Beginnings

Healthy Beginnings offers help and encouragement for parents and families while lessening the opportunities for abuse and neglect.

The Mission of Healthy Beginnings is to provide a cost effective nurse home visitation program that will improve pregnancy outcomes, child health, growth and development, and self-sufficiency for program eligible families. The effects of this program will benefit generations to come as these parenting skills are passed from generation to generation.

We provide weekly home visits for families prenatally and these visits continue until the youngest child in the home turns three years old. Nurses weigh the children and provide developmental screening so we can be sure that the child is developing appropriately. We provide support and role modeling to help make sure that children have the best care possible from their parents. We also provide referrals to other agencies and resources when families have need for them.

LANGENBERG LESSON SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

You are invited to participate in a very exciting program offered by the First Presbyterian Church, Hastings. Several years ago, through the generosity of the late Luella Langenberg, a program was established to encourage the youth of our church in their musical pursuits.

Parents of students in grades 1-12 may apply for up to \$250 per semester to offset the cost of private music instruction. Applicable areas of study include: piano, voice, guitar, or any band/orchestral instrument. Grants are limited to one per child. Parents must be members of First Presbyterian Church and students must be active participants in the church choir/music program.

Application forms will be available in the church office and on the church website starting January 4, 2019. DEADLINE FOR THE SPRING 2019 GRANT PROGRAM IS FEBRUARY 1, 2019. ALTHOUGH GRANTS ARE RENEWABLE, PARENTS MUST REAPPLY EACH SEMESTER.
