The Battle of Church vs. Sports

How many of you have had the conversation with your spouse, friends, co-workers or even your children about the balancing act of extra-curricular activities and church? It seems everything is battling for space in the day and it keeps creeping into the time usually allotted for church. It starts gradually and then, before we know it, the activity has taken the place of church. I'm not here to tell you how to fix it or that my family is doing it right, because every week is a challenge and a struggle to find the balance, but what I do want, is to share this story with you...

My son, Collin, recently joined a traveling baseball team. While I had prepared myself for the extra practices, the countless hours sitting on bleachers, and the weekends traveling to different locations to watch him play this sport he loves, I had not prepared myself for the e-mail from the coach saying that during the cold winter months, practices would be Wednesday evenings and Sunday afternoons. What?!

This is a huge conflict with our church activities, and while I am okay with occasionally missing church for an event, I am not okay with *consistently* replacing church for a sports activity.

Do I just go with the flow and let this sport interfere with all I believe in or do I stand up for the church and open up a conversation? Will opening up a conversation put him in a bad position with the coach and the rest of his teammates? Will not going to all the practices lessen his chance of playing time?

So many unanswered questions, but the decision was made and an email was sent back saying that Collin has a conflict with the practice schedule, he has church obligations and won't be able to attend all of the practices. The response I got back warmed my heart and gave me some assurance that all will be well in the world of church/sports if we can just maintain this kind of communication and balance. The coach replied back, "Church obviously comes first so I understand and nothing will be held against him for missing practice."

Many of you have been faced with this same scenario and may have even dealt with it in the same way. I recognize that this is not always an easy conversation to have, but at the end of the day we all need to keep having the conversations, communicating our thoughts, and standing up for our church and our beliefs, because the church will be a part of our lives for years to come and deserves to have its place on our weekly calendar.
