PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

We have some exciting news to share with you! As I celebrate my two year anniversary with the church on March 12, we have added 73 new members in that time; we are a growing church! We have had growth in membership, growth in attendance, and growth in giving. Our growth in membership and attendance means additional work for our pastoral staff, which we celebrate but also want to be careful to avoid burnout.

Our growth in giving, along with Kili's transition in the fall to less hours, has provided us an opportunity to consider a full-time Associate Pastor. As you know, Rev. Damen Heitmann has been serving as our half-time Associate Pastor for the last 18 months. As we finalized the budget and realized that we could afford a full-time Associate Pastor, we spent time in prayerful discernment, asking God to guide our steps forward.

The Personnel Committee met, prayed, and decided unanimously to recommend Pastor Damen for the full-time Associate Pastor. They forwarded that recommendation on to the Session, who also unanimously approved that decision after a robust discussion.

Damen has essentially been in an 18 month "job interview" for this position as he has served dependably as our half-time Associate Pastor. The consensus from the Personnel Committee and the Session is that Damen performed very well in this time. I echo that sentiment myself; Damen has been a gracious colleague, always willing to step in and help me when I needed him. He has done a faithful job of leading worship nearly every week and preaching once a month and is gifted in this area. His work with our high school youth and the Go and Serve team has been excellent and Damen has done a masterful job of building relationships with the youth and the adult volunteers.

On Sunday, March 24, we will hold a congregational meeting following our 10:30am service. The purpose of that meeting is three-fold:

- -We will vote to elect Damen as our full-time Associate Pastor
- -We will elect two new officers, one Deacon and one Trustee
- -We will present the 5 Year Strategic Plan for the church

(As a bonus, we will also vote on the new name for the old Middle School Annex building!)

I hope you will be able to join us for that meeting as we affirm Damen's call to serve our church family in this way. Should you have any questions about this decision or the process we followed, please feel free to come talk to me, any of your Elders on Session, or any of the Personnel Committee members, all listed below.

I am so grateful to be serving as your Pastor and look forward to our continued growth as we strive to be the church in this time and place and serve as the hands and feet of Jesus in our community and the world!





Congregational Life Committee members will provide table settings and drinks.




Hands Around the World Store
