PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

My heart is full of joy and gratitude for the way that you have responded to the flooding in Nebraska in the past four weeks. I want to update you on our efforts and continue to encourage your ongoing support in the coming months.

We are working in 3 areas to provide flood relief & recovery:

- 1. Wood River: Monthly trips to do construction projects on homes that were damaged by the floods. All are welcome to join us, contact the church office for details. We will also host short-term mission teams from other states that want to work in this area this summer so there will be opportunities to host these teams and provide them hospitality.
- 2. Boyd County: We have already taken 3 truckloads of supplies that they requested the week after the flood. We will continue to monitor the situation and provide supplies as requested. We will also plan a work trip there in the summer and could use volunteers for that.
- 3. Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota: This area was devastated by the floods and does not have the resources to recover. We are collecting funds and will send requested supplies and funds to our local contacts there.

Thank you for all you have done and will do. I was inspired to write the reflection below after joining the team in Wood River last weekend.

Sometimes love looks like writing a check or donating funds to support flood relief work.

Sometimes love looks like just showing up, and being present.


Pickle Ball?!!


