

Crimson Cupboard at Hastings College Donations Needed

The goal of LocalGlobal, a student-led service group at Hastings College, is to educate about food insecurity and other issues of poverty; and to contibute to the needs of our community, state,

country, and world. By definition, food insecurity means a person doesn't know where their next meal is coming from or can't afford food.

LocalGlobal is hosting a food drive to collect donations for the *Crimson Cupboard*, the campus food pantry for food insecure students. As a highly used resource, it is running low on supplies. Items most needed are peanut butter, jelly, canned fruit, vegetables, soup, beans, canned meat, and any other nonperishable items. Please drop items in the collection bin in the Memorial Room any time through April 28th.



Days for Girls is a global movement that prepares and distributes sustainable menstrual health solutions to girls who would otherwise miss school during their monthly periods.

This organization gives direction to provide personal hygiene kits to girls world-wide. Each kit is placed in a draw-string bag and includes reusable cloth menstrual pads made up of colorful shields and liners; panties; a washcloth and soap; zip-closure plastic bags and other items. The kit enables girls to carry their clean and used pads discreetly and to take care of their own hygiene needs. During the distributions, women and girls also receive health education to break stigmas and cultural taboos associated with menstruation.

May Friendship Day

May Friendship Day began in 1933 when two women's groups, meeting at separate luncheons, focused on children's health and the children of migrant families. In 1939, the groups merged to become the National Council of Church Women. The organization soon held its first annual observance of a day "to strengthen a growing sense of unity, the joy of Christian fellowship, and the power of Christianity in the day of need". In 1945, the observance officially became May Fellowship Day. In 1999, Church Women United changed the name to May Friendship Day. This year's May Friendship Day centers on working together despite our differences to address poverty in our community.

The overall theme for the 2019 celebration is "THE TIME IS NOW!" based on John 4:23a (CEB) "But the time is coming – and is here!" May Friendship Day focuses on uniting us in the spirit to do God's work, despite our differences.

At our celebration, we will be recognizing a Young church Women from each of our Church Women United represented churches and also will honor a Valiant Woman; a woman who has given service to CWU, her own church, and her community for an extended period of time.
