NOTABLE NOTES FROM...

KILI WENBURG

This past year I led FPC's "Spirituality Lab," which is a group that met every other Thursday morning to learn about and practice a different form of prayer with each gathering. The group is called a "lab" because it's a place to *experiment* with prayer to find out what works for you.

For the final spring Spirituality Lab gathering, we visited the HC labyrinth. The flat stones you see embedded into the ground in the picture below form circuitous pattern known as a labyrinth. The labyrinth, created by HC Christian Ministry students in 2005, is meant to provide a place of prayer for the community.

A labyrinth differs from a maze in that there is only one way in and one way out. Labyrinths have one continuous path that twists and turns, eventually leading to the center. There are no dead ends and nothing to figure out as you walk. The inherent hope built into the labyrinth is that there are no false turns, but that by putting one foot in front of the other, we will arrive at the goal of life. A maze is designed to make you lose your way, a labyrinth is designed to help you find your way.

In this photo (from photographer John Brooks), you see Tim Redline and Lanae Hall walking and praying....individually...together. (Note that Lanae is wrapped in a beautiful prayer shawl made by Sue Medsker-Nedderman.)

Praying with a labyrinth might be a good fit for you if:

- you tend to fall asleep while praying (can't fall asleep while walking!);
- you enjoy symbolic rituals (such as walking to the center to "leave behind" a grudge [for example] so that you can walk back into the world with freedom and forgiveness);
- your current prayer style could use some fresh air (literally or figuratively);
- you are an active person and feel your time is best spent when *doing* something;
- you are feeling confused, in need of inspiration, or needing to "unwind".

You can pray the labyrinth alone or with others. It can

take just a few minutes, or you can walk slowly for as long as you wish. MANY different ways of praying can be engaged while walking the labyrinth. If you are interested in trying it out, I created an instructional packet, some copies of which are available in the church office. Another labyrinth available to the whole community is located on the property of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church (near Hastings High School).

The spring weather invites us outside....God invites us to prayer...why not put the two together and try out labyrinth prayer sometime this week? You'll be glad you did!








Days for Girls is a global movement that prepares and distributes sustainable menstrual health solutions to girls who would otherwise miss school during their monthly periods.

This organization gives direction to provide personal hygiene kits to girls world-wide. Each kit is placed in a draw-string bag and includes reusable <u>cloth menstrual pads</u> made up of colorful shields and liners;

<u>panties</u>; a washcloth and soap; <u>zip-closure plastic bags</u> and other items. The kit enables girls to carry their clean and used pads discreetly and to take care of their own hygiene needs. During the distributions, women and girls also receive health education to break stigmas and cultural taboos associated with menstruation.


United Harvest May 18

THE WOLF AT TWILIGHT: An Indian Elder's Journey through a Land of Ghosts and Shadows by Kent Nerburn



This book study is sponsored by Presbyterian Women in the Synod of Lakes and Prairies and led by members of the PWS Native American Concerns Committee.

It is open to interested women and men across our synod, via Zoom (using computer or phone).

There is no charge to participate nor to use Zoom, yet registration is requested.

Daytime study begins: Monday, May 20, 2019 at 1:30 – 2:30 PM (CST) Evening study begins: Monday, May 20, 2019 at 6:30 – 7:30 PM (CST) Groups will meet every two weeks for five sessions

Synopsis: A note is left on a car windshield, an old dog dies, and Kent Nerburn finds himself back on the Lakota reservation where he traveled more than a decade before with a tribal elder named Dan. The touching, funny, and haunting journey that ensues goes deep into reservation boarding-school mysteries, the dark confines of sweat lodges, and isolated Native homesteads far back in the Dakota hills in search of ghosts that have haunted Dan since childhood. . . Nerburn brings the land of the northern High Plains alive and reveals the Native American way of teaching and learning with a depth that few outsiders have ever captured. (*The Wolf at Twilight* is the second in this series although one does not have to have read *Neither Dog nor Wolf* in order to participate in this study.)
