Notable Notes From... Pastor Greg

Dear First Presbyterian Church family:

The Pine Ridge Indian Reservation is just 350 miles northwest of us, but it feels like a completely different world when you are there. Oglala Lakota County, where the reservation is located, has the lowest per capita income (\$8,768) in the country, and ranks as the "poorest" county in the nation. The officially reported poverty rate for American Indians living on Pine Ridge is 53.75%.

We believe that everyone living on that reservation is a precious child of God, made in the image of God, and is deserving of human dignity and love.

First Presbyterian Church has a long history of helping our sisters and brothers at Pine Ridge. We ran Go and Serve mission trips there in 1982, 2008 and 2015. More recently we have had an ongoing drive for feminine hygiene products for school aged girls which we have been shipping to the schools on the reservation.

Unfortunately in the midst of the ongoing struggles with poverty, the Pine Ridge Reservation was profoundly impacted by the flooding in March 2019. Our congregation feels a call to respond so we will take a mission trip there in early June.

We will be working with Lakota Solar Enterprises, one of the first 100% Native-owned and operated renewable energy companies. They provide green job training opportunities for Native Americans including: Solar heating, solar water pumps and hot water systems, and business Development in Indian Country. They also do extensive reforestation projects.

Their base of operations and training center was severely impacted by the flooding. Our team will stay onsite at their training center and help with flood relief and recovery efforts in the area so that they can return to their work of empowering the local community and working to break the cycle of poverty on the Pine Ridge reservation and beyond.

We will also bring supplies that have been requested by the local community. These will include flood relief supplies, construction supplies, and basic necessities, particularly for babies.

There are four ways you can get involved in this vital work:

- 1. We need volunteers to help with the cleanup and light construction work.
- 2. We need volunteers to help support the team by traveling to prepare and cook meals.

(For traveling volunteers, we will depart Hastings at 6am on Friday, June 7 – Return to Hastings by 7pm on Monday, June 10.)

- 3. We need volunteers to help us plan, buy, and prepare the meals for the team before they leave.
- 4. We need supplies to take with us that have been requested by the community: diapers (newborn and sizes 4 & 5), wipes, teething medicine, baby bath stuff, powdered baby milk, bottles, baby clothing.

The situation at Pine Ridge is challenging, but we have the opportunity to help provide hope. We can be the hands and feet of Jesus to bring light and love into the community.



The **PW Father's Day** Offering this year will go to *The Guatemala Network of Living Waters for the World*. There will be a table in Memorial room for donations May 26, June 2, and June 16. You may also take donations to the church office during the week.

More than half of Guatemala's population lives below the poverty level, with nearly a quarter living on less than \$2/day. Many people lack a source of safe drinking water, which has a multiplying impact on poverty. Currently, there are over 210 Living Waters for the World filtration systems installed across Guatemala, providing each of the surrounding communities with an opportunity to live longer, more healthful lives because they are finally free of water-borne illness and disease.

The Guatemala Network of Living Waters for the World helps to support teams that go to Guatemala to install waters systems, and provides ongoing support to those systems through local in-country staff. Pastor Greg has served on the US board of Living Waters for the World for the past six years. He also serves on the Guatemala Board of Living Waters for the World. As such, he travels there twice a year to help support the operation.


