Dear First Presbyterian Church Family:

I wanted to open this note with a bold "HAPPY SUMMER!" But as I look out my office window at overcast skies and people walking by in coats, it doesn't quite feel like summer yet.

Even though the weather may not feel like summer, our church is rolling into summer mode quickly! Here are a few highlights:

We will be celebrating Vacation Bible School (VBS) this week. For the third year, we will host a traditional VBS in the mornings and a VBS for children with special needs in the afternoon. Typically more than half the kids that come are not members of our church, so this is a way for us to reach out and share the love and light of Christ with children and families in our community. Huge thanks to Steph Brader and her team of volunteers for running this great outreach ministry of love!

We have switched to our summer worship schedule, so we will only have one service each week at 10:30am, and our Sunday School for adults and children is on hiatus for the summer.

Pastor Damen joins us full-time starting July 1, and we are so excited about that!

Finally, we have the return of the Summer Sermon Song Series! For the past three summers, I have invited the congregation to suggest secular songs to me that they think could make a great sermon. The **PW Father's Day** Offering this year will go to *The Guatemala Network of Living Waters for the World*. There will be a table in Memorial room for donations May 26, June 2, and June 16. You may also take donations to the church office during the week.

More than half of Guatemala's population lives below the poverty level, with nearly a quarter living on less than \$2/day. Many people lack a source of safe drinking water, which has a multiplying impact on poverty. Currently, there are over 210 Living Waters for the World filtration systems installed across Guatemala, providing each of the surrounding communities with an opportunity to live longer, more healthful lives because they are finally free of water-borne illness and disease.

The Guatemala Network of Living Waters for the World helps to support teams that go to Guatemala to install waters systems, and provides ongoing support to those systems through local in-country staff. Pastor Greg has served on the US board of Living Waters for the World for the past six years. He also serves on the Guatemala Board of Living Waters for the World. As such, he travels there twice a year to help support the operation.

It means they will work alongside our professional carpenters to build new homes or repair existing ones. The team won't be bandaging problems; they will be solving housing issues for those who need it most.


It means the work our group provides is important and meaningful. They will witness firsthand the housing situation in our area, and they will be taking steps toward providing long-term solutions.
