A Holy-Spirit Filled Pentecost Week at First Presbyterian Church of Hastings!

I am bursting with holy pride and gratitude for our church family after this week. The Holy Spirit is alive and well at First Presbyterian Church, and it is moving in some beautiful and unexpected ways.

On *Monday* morning, we started our traditional Vacation Bible School. We opened it up to the whole community, and more than half the kids who came are not members. All the kids who came experienced the love of Christ because of an incredible group of volunteers and staff who made it happen. We had a group of middle school students from Hope Presbyterian Church in Omaha come and help us run our VBS as well. The Holy Spirit is at work!

On *Tuesday* afternoon, we started our Vacation Bible School for children with special needs for the third year. A few creative and compassionate church members realized that some kids don't always have the opportunity

to attend VBS, so we started this. Imagine 10 children with special needs and at least 20 volunteers learning bible stories, singing songs, dancing, playing, and praying together. The Holy Spirit is at work!

On *Thursday* night, a team of 5 men from Living Hope Community Church in Vancouver, Washington arrived. On Friday morning they joined up with two members of First Presbyterian Church to drive up to the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota to do flood relief and recovery work. We had flood relief supplies donated by a church in Kansas city. We had funds donated by a church in Colorado and donors from all over the United States. The team spent the weekend sharing the love of Christ in tangible ways to the people on the Pine Ridge Reservation. The Holy Spirit is at work!

On *Saturday* morning, our Go and Serve Youth Mission Team drove away from the First Presbyterian Church parking lot to spend a week helping to repair homes in Appalachia. 12 intrepid youth and 4 brave adult volunteers all gave up a week of their summer to help share the love and light of Christ with people in need. This continues the Go and Serve tradition that stretches back 50 years at First Presbyterian Church, an effort supported by the whole church through gifts and prayers. The Holy Spirit is at work!

On *Sunday* we hosted a spirit-filled Pentecost worship service. We joined with the Episcopalians and the Baptists for a joint worship service to rejoice in the unity that the Holy Spirit brings. We even

celebrated communion together with a bi-lingual, ecumenical communion liturgy. And we were joined by Raices de mi Pueblo, a Mexican folkloric dance troupe who shared their dances with us. The Holy Spirit is at work!

That all happened in just one week this summer. We will have many more weeks like it, including the United Harvest food distributions this summer with our Methodist sisters and brothers where we will serve 400-500 food insecure families. Every Sunday in the month of July, we will pack sack lunches right after worship, more than 6000 of them, as part of our partnership with Open Table and Catholic Social Services. We hope to run another flood relief and recovery trip up Boyd County in northern Nebraska to support our sisters and brothers there. The Holy Spirit is at work!

One of the creeds in the Presbyterian Book of Confessions is called "A Brief Statement of Faith." It describes the work of the Holy Spirit this way:

We trust in God the Holy Spirit, everywhere the giver and renewer of life.

The Spirit: justifies us by grace through faith, sets us free to accept ourselves and to love God and neighbor, and binds us together with all believers in the one body of Christ, the Church...

In a broken and fearful world the Spirit gives us courage:

to pray without ceasing,

to witness among all peoples to Christ as Lord and Savior,

to unmask idolatries in Church and culture,

to hear the voices of peoples long silenced,

and to work with others for justice, freedom, and peace.

May we continue to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit in our own lives and may the Holy Spirit guide our church to be a source of love and light in the world.

Sara Babcock, Young Adult Volunteer

Sara Babcock has been accepted into the PC(USA) Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) Program. The program is an **ecumenical**, faithbased **year of service** for young people (ages 19–30) in sites

across the United States and around the world. YAVs accompany local agencies working to address root causes of poverty and reconciliation. Alongside this work, volunteers explore the meaning of their Christian faith and accountability to their neighbors in community with peers and mentors. She will do her year of service in Washington D.C.

Sara was confirmed in our church as a youths. Following her graduation from Kalamazoo, MI with a degree in history, Sara moved back to the Hastings/Grand Island area and has been attending services here. She presented information to our mission committee about her decision to commit to this program. She also briefly shared this information with our congregation during the church service last Sunday.

Although YAVs receave a modest stipend and shared housing benefit, they are required to raise \$2,000 by July. Sara would like to stay connected and communicate with our congregation from Washington DC about what she is doing and learning from this experience.
