eagerly every year. This year 639 people - adults, teens, children, babies and toddlers - came together for a wonderful week to learn about having civil conversations in uncivil times.

One of the reasons I and others come back to Synod School year after year is the sense of community



that we have with one another. One extended family makes Synod School their family reunion every year. They are a group of 18 or 20, depending on the year and who can attend. I have made friends that will be life-long, and we joyfully greet each other every year. If someone can't attend one year, others tell them how much they are missed. The community also is intentional about enfolding those who come for the first time, making sure that they feel included in the traditions of Synod School.

The community eats together, prays together, sings together, learns together, and even mourns together when someone from the community dies. We each need a community like this in which to ground

ourselves so that we can have support during our trying times and mutual rejoicing during our joyful times. Presbyterian Women is this kind of a group for me, and I hope it can be such a community for each of you, too. It takes work and intentionality for that to happen, but I know that it can be a reality. I challenge each of you to think about your local group, and if it isn't a welcoming community, what can you do to make that happen?





An additional set of information under the Groups tab is forthcoming. It will include lists of members in each of the boards, committees, and organizations that are a part of the life of our congregation.




