PASTOR GREG

Dear First Presbyterian Church family:

My heart is still bursting with joy from Sunday, August 18! It was the kick-off for our children's and youth programming. Our Director of Christian Education, Stephanie Brader, provided a great orientation to all of our parents. It was amazing to walk into the Fellowship Hall and see every seat full and lots of people standing; our children's and youth ministries at FPC are vibrant and bursting with life. I had the chance to go around to each Sunday school room and see the teachers and students begin to share with one another, study the bible together, and grow together in faith. What a joy!

Our guest liturgist was Sara Babcock, who grew up in this church. This week she is starting a year of service in the Presbyterian Young Adult Volunteer Program. She will be volunteering in Washington D.C. working with people living in poverty, and she will be living in an intentional Christian community with other young adults who are also spending a year volunteering. Sara did a beautiful job helping to lead worship and read scripture, and we prayed with her for the coming year.

In the summer, children who receive Langenberg scholarships from the church to take music lessons help lead worship by playing music. The Schukei boys both played a song on the piano as part of worship, and it was amazing to see their progress from last year and to have them share their musical gifts with the church as a way of giving thanks and glory to God!

Another child of the church, who is now a graduate student in vocal performance and spent the summer singing opera in Europe, also helped to lead worship! Nathan Jensen, accompanied by his sister, Hannah Jensen, on piano, sang two beautiful pieces of sacred music from Antonin Dvorak that helped shape our worship.

We did a special commissioning service for all of our Christian Education volunteers. It was spectacular to see so many volunteers. The congregation prayed for them, and then the children came down and blessed them. After that, I reminded those volunteers and our whole church family that their work and love of our children and youth plant the seeds that produce young adults who share their gifts with the church and the world like Sara and Nathan.

We continued the Summer Sermon Song Series with a sermon on "Bridge Over Troubled Water" by Simon and Garfunkel. I recruited Peter Lainson to play guitar, and he and Pastor Damen sang with me, so we had a striking live version of the song as part of the sermon, which reflected on the biblical story of Ruth and Naomi as well as God's steadfast support of us as expressed in Psalm 46.

Mary Plock and Phill Parker shared another live version of the "Bridge Over Troubled Water" as an offertory that was so moving that it brought many people to tears. Our organist, Linda Vollweiler, did a wonderful job of putting us in a worshipful space with a lovely prelude, led our hymns beautifully, and offered a postlude that sent us out into the world ready to serve.

We are blessed with such an abundance of talent at First Presbyterian Church in so many ways. I'm so grateful to help lead a church that worships and glorifies God and shares its gifts with the world. Thank you for all you do to fill our community and my heart with joy!


